Wheeler Suggests Considering All Pre-attacked Notes

WASHINGTON, Sept. 18 (UP) — Sen. Burton K. Wheeler, D., Mont., suggested today every communication of the war, navy and state departments in the days prior to Dec. 7, 1941, be considered in the forthcoming congressional investigation of the Pearl Harbor attack. Wheeler, a leading senate prewar isolationist, endorsed the idea of a congressional investigation and demanded: "All communications between the state department and the Japanese government should be brought out in the investigation."

Wheeler said in an interview, "So should all the reports of the army and navy intelligence at the time. There can be no excuse for not doing so, now that the war has been won."

Hammer Attack Fatal To 5 Year Old Girl

TACOMA, Sept. 18 (UP) — Five-year-old Mary Ann Wessel, who with her mother and two older sisters was the victim of a vicious hammer attack early yesterday, died last night a few hours after the husband and father was arrested for the assault.

Hospital attendants said Evelyn Wessel, the 35-year-old mother, still was in poor condition.

Snead Arrives for Play at Spokane

SPOKANE, Sept. 18 (UP) — Sam Snead, early favorite to capture the third annual Esmeralda \$10,000 open golf tournament starting Thursday, arrived last night from Tulsa, Okla., where he stormed to an easy victory in the southwestern invitational open. Another early arrival was Ben Hogan of Hershey, Pa., who tied for second place at Tulsa.

Other golfers will arrive today, including Jimmy Hines of Chicago, Barney Clark of Denver, Ed Furgal of Detroit and Virgil Shreeve of San Francisco. Byron Nelson, biggest money-maker in golf, and Harold (Jug) McSpaden play an exhibition match at Butte, Mont., today before moving here.

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Typhoon Hits Tokyo, All Planes Grounded

TOKYO, Sept. 18 (UP) — A typhoon struck Tokyo today, interrupting occupation operations and wrecking makeshift homes of hundreds of air-raid victims.

All military and naval planes were grounded and small-boat communications between American naval vessels in Tokyo bay and the shore were halted temporarily.

Gen. Douglas MacArthur's headquarters, meantime, revealed occupation forces have spread out over an 800-mile stretch of the Japanese homeland, with 65,000 or more troops concentrated within a 30-mile radius of Tokyo.
