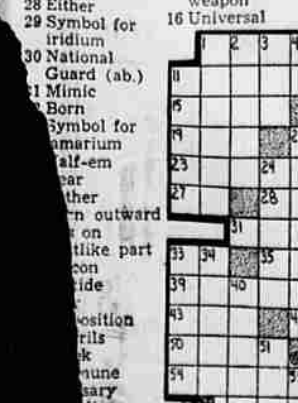

Man Made Flood to Lift Jammed Barge

THE DALLES, Sept. 19 (UP) — A petroleum barge which lodged at the brink of Celilo falls last July now is jammed sideways in the swift, narrow channel below the falls and government engineers have opened the gates at Grand Coulee to raise the river level two feet. It takes 80 hours for the water to reach Celilo from Coulee and the next attempt to move the barge will be made Friday or Saturday.

Five Candidates For Rural Fire Protection Board

Candidates for directors of the Union rural fire protection district have been announced. They are: James Conoway, R. B. Davis, Leonard Huffman, Odin Miller, and Ben Stonedahl.

Voters at the special election, to be held Sept. 26, are to vote for five directors. Where the election will be held has not been decided as yet, but it will be held somewhere outside the city limits of Union.

Petitions for the formation of the district were received in July, and a hearing was scheduled for Aug. 7. Since no objections were received at the hearing, an order was set establishing the area.

When fire protection districts are formed, the people may purchase their own equipment, or may contract with a city for protection.

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State Seeks Head For Department

Oregon state civil service commission announces an open competitive examination for the purpose of providing a list of qualified persons from which the commission will obtain a director to be the executive and administrative head of the civil service in Oregon.

Salary will be between \$4,500 and \$5,000 yearly, and the post is open to all citizens of the United States not less than 30 years of age at the time application is filed. Applications must be on file in the office of the commission on or before Oct. 15.

Application forms may be obtained from the office of the state civil service commission, 319 State Capitol Building, Salem.

Written tests will be given in Salem and Portland, and such other places in Oregon as the number of candidates warrants and conditions permit.

Minimum qualifications include graduation from an accredited four-year college or university, and at least five years of successful full-time paid employment within the last 10 years.

A veteran of any of the wars of the United States who has successfully completed all phases of the entrance test shall be accorded five points, and if any veteran has a certified service-connected disability of not less than 10 percent, he shall be accorded another five points.
