30 Countries Have Ratified Charter

LONDON, Oct. 5 (UP)—Thirty countries—one more than necessary to bring it into being—have ratified the charter of the new United Nations organization, Edward R. Stettinius, jr., announced today.

Stettinius, American delegate, told the executive committee of the UNO's preparatory commission Washington also had advised him 11 countries already have deposited their ratifications in the U. S. capital.

Ten others indicated their ratifications are on the way to Washington for deposit.

Mt. Emly Lumber Company Makes Strike Statement

(Continued from Page 1)

Despite this complete lack of good faith collective bargaining on the part of the Union, the Union has seen fit to indulge in strike action.

In so indulging in strike action, the Union is using as a basis therefore the inability or refusal of the Operators to agree to the Union's demand that all past negotiation practices be disregarded and that all Operators who produce or work with wood in any state or condition in the five mentioned Western States, whether such Operators be loggers, lumber manufacturers, door, match, plywood, box, barrels or specialty producers, negotiate on an industry wide basis as one bargaining group.

The Union, in its attempt to force this new, novel and unfounded procedure on the Operators, hopes to eliminate all existing differences between the basic wages received by any and all employees in any segment or section of the five Western states who produce, handle or process any lumber products.

THEREBY, THE BASIC WAGE OF A LOGGER IN THE CENTRAL & EASTERN OREGON PINE AREA AND THE BASIC WAGE RECEIVED BY MINOR GIRLS ENGAGED IN HANDLING THE VERY SMALL AND LIGHT PACKAGE VENEER GOING INTO THE MAKING OF STRAWBERRY BOXES ON THE WEST COAST OF WASHINGTON AND OREGON WOULD BE THE SAME.

The entire position of Lumber & Sawmill Workers Union is clearly stated by its own officials who recently reported in the Union Register, the Union's official newspaper, as follows: "Two important actions taken at last week's Northwest Council Executive committee meeting in Seattle were: (1) That all 'offers' from individual Operators or groups of Operators for settlement with the local Union or District Council must be immediately referred to the Northwest Council's Strike Policy Committee and no local Union or District Council is to make 'settlement' on its own without specific permission from this committee." (2) That no Lumber & Sawmill Workers Union shall make a statement to the public press on the current strike situation without specific permission from the Northwest Council's Policy Committee."
