Carlot Shipments Of Fruit 4,631

Carlot shipments of fruits and vegetables from the Pacific Northwest amounted to 4,631 cars during the week ending Oct. 6.

Loadings included 1,684 cars of potatoes, 1,132 of apples, 926 of pears, 492 of onions, 157 of lettuce and smaller shipments of carrots, prunes, celery and other items.

Oregon shipped 1,102 cars during the week, including 525 of pears, 268 of potatoes, 206 of onions, 57 cars of lettuce, 18 of celery, 9 of beets, 8 of apples, 7 of green corn and 2 cars of cabbage.

The potato market turned weaker the past week. Price declines occurred at shipping point and terminal markets. At Portland, Monday, Deschutes and Klamath gems sold to retailers at \$2.65 to \$3, about 35 cents under a week previous.

With the exception of apples, supplies of most fresh fruits will be as larger or larger than last fall. The light apple crop in eastern states this year makes it necessary that a large proportion of government requirements be obtained from Oregon and Washington. The Oregon and Washington crop is estimated to be about 93 percent of average.

Hay Market Quiet; Plenty of Feed

The hay market at Portland was very quiet during the week ending Oct. 9. Fall pastures are furnishing considerable feed as the result of recent rains and availability of home and locally grown feeds and forage have lessened the need for hay from outside areas. This was reflected in receipts of only three cars of alfalfa and one car of grass hay.

Carlot receipts of all hay at Portland since July 1 have amounted to 124 cars compared to 137 last year.

Quotations at Portland were nominally unchanged. California hay markets turned a little firmer the past week as a result of rains in some producing areas and strength in other feedstuffs. Eastern markets continued firm with demand in excess of supplies at some points.

Stocks Irregular; Utilities Strong

NEW YORK, Oct. 11 (UP)—Stocks moved irregularly in moderately active trading today, featured by heavy volume and strength in utilities.

Utility shares responded to anticipation of benefits from a tax reduction. Their average reached a new high since Feb. 16, 1937.

Large blocks of the various issues appeared on the tickers in the afternoon. Low-priced issues were heavily traded around the previous closing levels. Preferred issues were strong.
