

# Woods and Riffles

Steelhead angling on the Columbia river below McNary dam has been fair to good. Angling for liberated rainbow on the upper south fork of the Walla Walla river between the power plant and Elbow canyon has been excellent. The upper Umatilla river between Bobsled creek and the forks is producing good to excellent catches of liberated rainbow. Angling has been fair on the north fork of John Day river above highway 395. McKay reservoir remains slow but a few nice catches are being made with flatfish on a slow troll in the late evening.

Upper Catherine creek should produce excellent catches of liberated rainbow this weekend. Drift fishermen on the Grande Ronde river between Rondowa and Troy have been making good catches of rainbow to 18 inches in length with grasshoppers.

The Wallowa river between Joseph and Enterprise is producing fair to good catches of Eastern brook and rainbow. Rainbow angling has been only fair on the Lostine river. Rainbow angling remains good to excellent at Wallowa lake.

Angling in the high Wallowa lakes has been good. Horseshoe, Crescent, Mirror, Douglas and Moccasin lakes have been producing good catches of eastern brook to the fly anglers in the late evening. Bait angling is spotty in the high lakes during the middle of the day.

Rainbow angling on the Imnaha river has been good with lures and good to excellent on flies in the late evening. The Imnaha is also producing a few good dolly varden. Angling has been slow at Duck and Twin lakes but occasional good catches of eastern brook to 12 inches in length have been made. Fish lake is producing good to excellent catches of eastern brook.

Upper Eagle creek and Pine creek should remain good for liberated rainbow. Lookingglass, Eagle and Bear lakes have been producing cutthroats to 14 inches in length and good catches of eastern brook. Rainbow angling on the upper Powder river above Sumpter should be fair in several of the ponds adjacent to the stream channel. Angling at Anthony lake should be fair to good in the early morning for liberated rainbow. Grande Ronde lake should produce excellent catches of liberated rainbow this weekend. The last reports from Unity, Higgins and Murray reservoirs indicate angling remains slow.

### Davis Sets World Mark In Hurdles

BUDAPEST, Hungary (UPI)—Glenn Davis' unbroken string of victories capped by a new 400-meter hurdles world record established him today as the top star of the United States track team's tour of Europe.

Davis has won all six individual events he entered in meets at Moscow, Warsaw and here, plus other victories in relay races.

In addition, he's expected to score another "double" in the United States vs. Greece meet at Athens on Saturday and Sunday. The U. S. squad was scheduled to leave by plane today for that city, winding up its brilliant tour in the country that gave birth to the Olympic Games.

Davis zoomed to a new world mark of 49.2 seconds for the 400-meter hurdles Wednesday. That clipped three-tenths of a second off the record of 49.5 seconds that Davis established during the tryouts for the 1956 Olympic Games.

It also led the United States men's team to an unofficial 127-68 victory over the Hungarian men's team in the two-day competition at Nep-Stadium. No official count of points was made.

In addition, the U. S. women's team, which had been outscored both by the Russians in Moscow and the Poles in Warsaw, outpointed the Hungarian girls, 64-54.
