NEW YORK STOCKS
NEW YORK (UPI)—Week-end buying and short covering today carried the stock market to a new high since July 25, 1937.
Net gains ranging to more than 2 points spread over a broad list with the best showing in chemicals, aircrafts, oils, and special issues.
The market seemed to get a bit of a lift from the announcement that the White House would have an important item for release in the afternoon. It was noted that the actual announcement of the polar expedition brought some dip in trading and prices slipped back from their best levels.
Demand for the chemicals had carried the whole group to new highs with gains ranging from 2 to 3 points in such issues as Allied

Man Confesses 'Killing', Finds It Never Occurred
HAMBURG, Germany (UPI)—On the night of Jan. 31, 1933, while returning home from night school, Mende became involved in a street fight between Nazis and Communists. He threw a wooden post ripped from a fence at a Nazi Storm Trooper in self-defense.
The next morning a newspaper said the Nazi had been "murdered." Frightened, Mende fled the country, joining the Foreign Legion. Then Arab friends "smuggled" him onto a freighter bound for Australia. When World War II broke out, he was in Peru.
He sent letters with money to the Nazi's family. Then he feared the letters were intercepted and he fled to Brazil, making a fortune in real estate.
Recently, he said, his worries caused a nervous breakdown, and after recovering he decided to return to Germany.
Investigation by police showed the newspaper which had reported the death of the Nazi printed a correction the day after Mende fled, saying the man had been injured. The Nazi, it turned out, died on the Russian front in 1942.

Large Farm Real Estate Exchange Told
One of the largest farm real estate transactions in Oregon in recent months, was consummated by Willamette Valley Realty, of Corvallis, it was announced by Claude E. Mariner, accredited farm broker.
The H. K. Umpleby farm, near Junction City, was exchanged by Mr. and Mrs. Umpleby for the eastern Oregon ranch owned by Mr. and Mrs. Vernon Puckett, at North Powder.
The Umplebys have been handling a substantial specialty crop operation together with a grade "A" producing dairy of some 70 cows. The specialty crops have consisted mainly of green beans, sweet corn, and some other vegetables, with the larger portion being green beans. The Pucketts expect to carry on in substantially the same manner.
The Puckett ranch has been handled as a wheat, alfalfa, and cattle ranch, with the main emphasis being upon the production of alfalfa hay and pasture. The Umplebys indicate that they will continue in a similar manner.
Here is a case where one family, the Pucketts, former Willamette Valley residents, wished to return to farming in the valley. Another family, the Umplebys, former wheat farmers, wished to return to a ranch type operation. A fine example of property exchange to the benefit of all parties concerned.

Court Acquires Playwright In Contempt Case
WASHINGTON (UPI)—The U.S. Court of Appeals has ordered that playwright Arthur Miller be acquitted of contempt of Congress charges arising from his appearance before the House Committee on Un-American activities in 1956. Miller is the husband of actress Marilyn Monroe.
The 42-year-old dramatist, winner of a Pulitzer prize for his play "Death of a Salesman," was convicted two years ago for refusing to name persons present with him at a 1947 meeting of writers alleged to have Communist connections.
Miller testified freely as to his own activities but insisted that his conscience would not allow him to be an informer on others. He did not invoke the Fifth Amendment.
Today's brief, unsigned opinion said that, according to the record, Miller urged the committee chairman not to press him for an answer about the 1947 meeting and requested that the answer be deferred until a later time. Chairman agreed, the opinion said.

Elsie Cauthorn Funeral Rites Set
Elsie Cauthorn, 72, who lived at 1907 Second street here, died Aug. 6 at her home.
Funeral services will be held at the graveside by Dempsey Snodgrass Chapel on Saturday, Aug. 10 at 10 a.m. Rev. Louis M. Samson will officiate. Services and burial will be at City Cemetery.
Mrs. Cauthorn was born at Sheboygan, Wis. on Dec. 8, 1865. She had been a resident of La Grande for over 35 years. Her husband, Carter, preceded her in death early this year.
The ruling was made by the entire nine-judge bench of the court.

Fair Reserve Seat Tickets On Sale Now
SALEM (UPI)—Reserved seat tickets for the night revue, the horse show and rodeo and the races at the 93rd Oregon State Fair are now on sale at fair offices here, Manager Howard Maple said Thursday.
Maple said the tickets will also go on sale at Meier & Frank, in Salem and Portland, starting Aug. 15 and at a special fair booth in downtown Salem the same day.
Maple said he expected a sell out for the night revue which headlines Jimmy Rodgers and Vaughn Monroe.
Also featured will be the Sportsmen quartette, long on the Jack Benny show.

Girl Credited With Saving Four Brothers, Sisters
DALLAS, Ore. (UPI)—An alert 15-year-old girl was credited with saving the lives of her four younger brothers and sisters Wednesday morning as fire swept their two-story frame home here.
Frances Shaffer, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Clayton, was taking care of the children while her parents and four other children were picking beans near Independence.
Dallas Fire Chief Dan Duff said Frances smelled smoke and dashed to the second floor and awakened her nine-year-old brother, Joey.
Frances then led Joey, Danny Shaffer, 7, Linda Clayton, 3, and Tommy Clayton, 2, from the blazing home. The plucky girl then ran to a neighbor's home and alerted the fire department.
Chief Duff said Joey probably would have been asphyxiated in his sleep if the girl had been a minute or two later.
A pet monkey and a small dog were burned to death in the blaze, only a few blocks from the downtown business district.
