more of them vote for Democratic than for Republican candidates. Democratic leaders in California and other states outside the south seem to have no trouble presenting a united front against right-to-work laws.

Eighteen states now have such laws. In six more, the issue is scheduled to be put before the voters in referendum form in the elections Nov. 4. The six are California, Colorado, Idaho, Kansas, Ohio and Washington.

The politically important state of California will be a major battleground because of the potential impact of the issue on the contests between candidates. After a year showing in the primary voting two months ago, California Republicans are heading into the campaign as underdogs in a state where they have consistently been winning statewide elections.

Senate Republican leader William F. Knowland, nominee for governor of California, favors the proposed law in his state. Gov. Goodwin J. Knight, GOP candidate for Senator, opposes it. There

was a head-on collision between them at the state GOP convention a week ago.

With Knowland's blessing, the platform committee wrote a labor plank taking no stand on the right-to-work proposition and describing it as the responsibility of the voters, not of any political party. Knight called the plank a step backward and supported a minority bloc which wanted to retain the 1956 labor plank explicitly endorsing the right of unions to negotiate union shop contracts.

One Knowland supporter said the minority proposal would read the nominee for governor right out of the party. Another said it would cause irreparable damage to Knowland and other GOP candidates favoring a right-to-work.

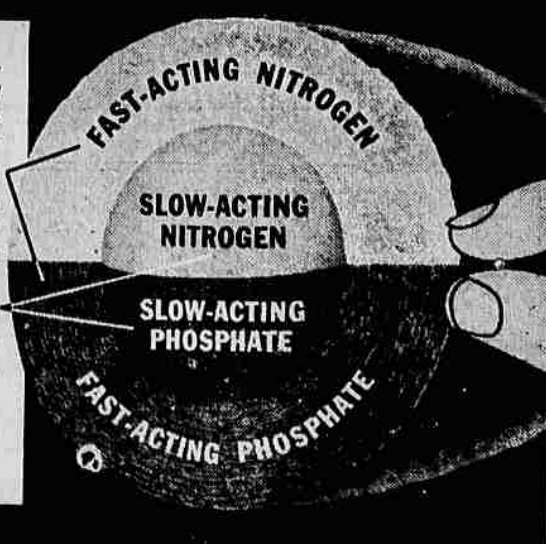

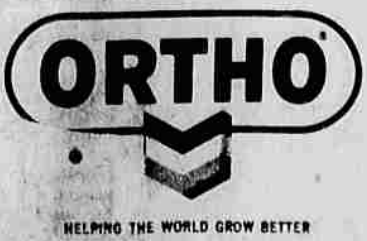
