Grain Shipments Off To Good Start
SALEM (UPI) - Grain movement of the new 1958-59 crop was off to a good start last month when 11.2 million bushels of incoming grain was inspected at the Portland office of the State Agriculture Department.

This compares with seven million bushels of incoming grain checked the year before.

The large increase was principally due to barley, according to T. Ralph Harry, chief of the Department's grain inspection division.

New York Stocks

NEW YORK (UPI)—Stocks had another setback today but this one came on sharply reduced volume which the bullish forces said was a favorable omen.
Price declines seldom got beyond a point. Chemicals and metals suffered the widest losses. Individual steels, rails, aircrafts and special issues met selling that forced them down more than a point. But on the whole, the market moved through a fairly narrow arc.

Losses in the chemicals extended to 2 points in DuPont at the worst. Drugs joined the chemicals in their descent.

Metals were depressed on the easier tendency in copper prices and a reduction in the Kennecott dividend.

Utilities suffered a decline that was wide for the group. Automobile shares were mixed in a narrow area.

Clues Sought In Air Wreck

NANTUCKET, Mass. (UPI)—Investigators today resumed their hunt through the scattered wreckage of a Northeast airliner in hopes of finding some clue to the cause of the crash which killed 33 persons.
Representatives of four agencies tried to reconstruct the last minutes of the ill-fated plane and police began an intensive search for the missing 200-pound nosewheel of the craft.

Authorities said the wheel may have been carted off by some of the hundreds of curious who swarmed to the wooded area where the plane went down in a thick fog Friday night.

FEAR RADIOACTIVE DUST

TOKYO (UPI)—The Japanese group conducting surveys of the South Pacific for the International Geophysical Year said today it would send out no more ships until the United States halts its nuclear tests. It made its decision following the showering of two Japanese survey ships with radioactive dust after a U. S. test in the Bikini Atoll.

CHINESE REDS ACTIVE

TAIPEI, Formosa (UPI)—Communists shore batteries hurled 88 shells at Nationalist China's Quemoy outpost islands today, and Soviet-built MIG-17 jets ranged over the Formosa Strait, the Nationalist Defense Ministry announced.

Thornton Rules On Bail Deposits

SALEM (UPI) - Attorney General Robert Y. Thornton has ruled that bail deposits made by automobile associations cannot be returned until the association shows that its members can no longer use their membership cards as bail.
Under Oregon law, such associations may offer bail bond service to their members through such deposits. Members may then use their membership cards as bail in connection with traffic arrests.

Thornton's ruling was that such associations, before reclaiming their deposits, must show that there were no unexpired cards in circulation for use as bail and that such cards were no longer issued.

Ontario Boy's Body Recovered In Snake

ONTARIO (UPI)—State police officers of the state game department Saturday recovered the body of seven-year-old Martin Naillon who drowned Wednesday in the Snake river about one mile north of here.

Officers said the body was floating near the shore line and was located 20 miles downstream from where the boy disappeared.

WASHINGTON (UPI) - President Eisenhower returned to his desk at the White House today after a week end of golf and relaxation at his Gettysburg, Va., farm.

NAUTILUS ENROUTE HOME

PORTLAND, Eng. (UPI)—The U. S. atomic submarine Nautilus leaves here today on the week-long voyage to the Brooklyn Navy Yard, running underwater all the way.
