Gas Barge Explodes At Pasco

PASCO, Wash. (UPI)-A barge unloading its cargo of gasoline ex-ploded here this morning, causing fire which threatened 16 storage tanks before it was brought under

The barge, City of Longview No 535, had pumped out most of its cargo of 328,000 gallons but still had about 50,000 gallons aboard when the explosion occurred. The blast rattled windows a mile away and hurled a portion

of the superstructure 75 feet. A portion of the barge remained above water and burned fiercely. Flames swept beneath the dock causing about \$25,000 damage to the dock, Pasco Fire Chief Lyle Cooney said.

Walter Pirtle, 29, Kennewick, Wash., was hurled into the water but made it to shore and was taken to Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital here where his condition was reported as fair.
