

# 500 Mile Pilots Get Warning

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind. (UPI) — Speedway drivers get a final word of caution today in the last preliminary before Saturday's 43rd annual 500 mile dash against death in an effort to prevent the chase from adding a 51st victim to the track fatality list.

There will be no cars running on the 2½ mile oval track today and all drivers with their pit crews must show up at 1 p.m. c.d.t. to get a lecture on racing rules from chief steward Harlan Fongler.

Fongler said he'd be stiffer than ever in his annual lecture to warn the pilots that driving regulations would be strictly enforced and that violations might cost victory, which would mean about half of the total purse of a record \$300,000 plus.

**Pace Lap Tricks**  
Particularly he'll warn against ticks on the pace lap and the first lap of the race in an effort to prevent any repetition of last year's debacle in which the first

three cars made one more pace lap than the rest of the field and barely got into position when the race began. The goof was blamed partially in some quarters for the first lap crack-up, involving 15 cars, in which Pat O'Connor was killed.

The chances were against another mixup since last year's starting formula was dropped and this time the 11 rows of 3 cars each will make a parade lap in their proper alignment and then will turn the pace lap behind the pace car before the race begins.

**Weather Outlook Favorable**  
Other than the drivers' meeting there was no activity scheduled on the track. Instead the asphalt and brick surface was slated for a final sweeping down to eliminate all debris that might interfere with the near 200 mile per hour speeds some pilots will hit on the long stretches, and pit crews might get brief warmups on procedures.

The weather outlook was favorable, although the temperature might soar into the high 80's before the finish. Though showers were expected, forecasters anticipated they would hold off until after the race, and clouds were expected to cut the heat from the sun on the pilots.

## Oriole's Hoyt Wilhelm Wins Seventh Straight

Gentlemen, we give you Hoyt Wilhelm—except that Paul Richards says he can't be had "even for a million dollars."

Money isn't everything and right now Wilhelm is to the pennant-minded Baltimore Orioles. No wonder!

The 35-year-old knuckleballer has won seven straight without a loss. He has a spectacular 1.12 earned run average, the capacity to pitch every third day if necessary, and the confidence that no one can hit him when he's right.

Wilhelm's latest effort was a 5-0 victory over the Yankees Thursday night. The triumph boosted Baltimore to within 1½ games of first place in the American League and extended Wilhelm's streak against the Yanks to 21 1-3 consecutive scoreless innings.

"There comes a time," said the elated Richards after the game, "when a player is worth more money to a ball club than anyone could possibly pay for him. I wouldn't consider one million dollars for Wilhelm."

**Beats Yanks Fourth Time**  
Given a chance to start by Richards, the veteran National League castoff has now beaten the Yankees four straight times. During that span, he has allowed the world champions a total of two runs while pitching a no-hitter and a one-hitter against them.

Ralph Terry, obtained from Kansas City earlier in the week, faced Wilhelm Thursday night and hurled well although charged with his fifth defeat. The Orioles nicked him for three runs in four hits during the first seven innings, then picked up their final runs when Gene Woodling hit a two-run homer off reliever Bobby

**Johnson Seeks Ring Victory**

NEW YORK (UPI) — Heavyweight Alonzo Johnson of Bradock, Pa., seeks his 12th straight victory and a contender's rating tonight in his Madison Square Garden debut against Nino Valdes of Cuba.

Contender Valdes, 34, is favored at 9-5 to beat Johnson, 24, and win his first real comeback test since being stopped by Charley Powell, March 4.

Six-foot-three Nino is favored over six-foot Johnson because he is a contender, ranked sixth by the Ring Magazine and eighth by the NBA. Also because of his greater experience and punch.

Jim Mudgett Grant was the loser.

Vic Wertz's two-run homer in the eighth inning along with Frank Sullivan's two-hit pitching enabled the Red Sox to down the Senators. The only run Washington scored was unearned, but Sullivan had no kick coming because all three Boston runs off loser Pedro Ramos also resulted from errors.

The worm finally turned for Friend, loser of his first seven games, as he posted his first victory of the season with a fine four-hit shutout over the Braves. The Pirates scored all their runs off Joey Jay in the fifth inning.

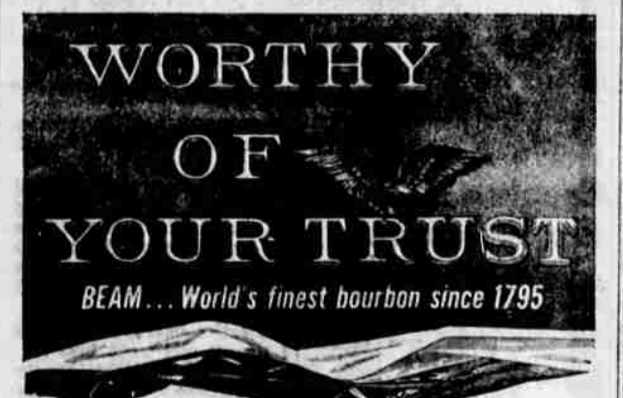
