WEST LOS ANGELES (UPI)—George Reeves, actor who played "Superman" in a television series, early today committed suicide by shooting himself, police said.

Detectives said Reeves was found dead in his Benedict Canyon home, a Luger pistol by his side. Reeves, 45, had appeared in numerous film and TV productions. His motion picture credits included many Hopalong Cassidy films, "From Here To Eternity," "Gone With the Wind," "Winged Victory," "So Proudly We Hail" and "Till We Meet Again."

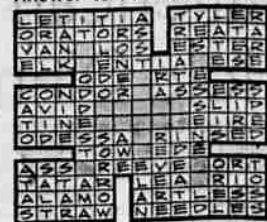
DEATH HOUR ADVANCED OSSINING, N.Y. (UPI)—The execution hour at Sing Sing—11 p.m. the last 43 years—has been moved up to 10 p.m., it was announced Sunday. Authorities said the new hour would preclude disturbing the governor late at night in an emergency, would be more convenient for witnesses and would enable fuller news coverage of executions.
