Catholic Bishop Warns Firemen At Conference

SPOKANE (UPI) — A Catholic bishop from Oregon warned delegates to the Pacific Coast Fire-mountain Association of Fire Chiefs convention here Wednesday that "carelessness is more deadly than all the bullets ever made."

The Most Reverend Francis P. Leppig, bishop from Baker, said that carelessness caused 12,000 deaths by fire in this country each year and that one third of those killed were children under six years.

He told the visiting fire chiefs that fire departments were recognized as a symbol of community-wide organization to promote and encourage fire prevention.

The convention ends tonight.

Changes Made In Indian Law

PORTLAND (UPI) — The Interior Department today announced a change in federal regulations which will permit the Bureau of Indian Affairs to make loans to withdrawing members of the Klamath Indian tribe of Oregon regardless of their degree of Indian blood.

Under former rules, loans could not be made to individuals of less than a quarter degree Indian blood. The amendment of the regulations was made possible as a result of legislation recommended by the Interior Department and recently enacted by Congress. The Indian Bureau has been making loans to withdrawing Klamath tribe members of one-fourth or more Indian blood since last February.

Loans have been made without interest and have been set off against funds payable to the borrowers under the Klamath termination act.

Chessman Sets New Petition

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — Convict-author Caryl Chessman will petition the California Supreme Court for a re-hearing within the next two weeks, according to attorney Rosalie Asher.

Miss Asher, who visited Chessman at San Quentin prison Wednesday, said the convicted kidnap-rapist was not optimistic that a new appeal to the court would succeed. However, she said he planned to go back to the U.S. Supreme Court if necessary.

"I think he has a better than even chance in the U. S. Supreme Court," she said.

The State Supreme Court affirmed the two death sentences, against Chessman last week. Condemned under California's "Little Lindbergh Law," Chessman has spent 11 years in death row at San Quentin. One of his principal contentions is that the transcript of his original trial was faulty.

Although not an attorney of record for Chessman, Miss Asher has been associated with the case at various times during the past 11 years.

"There is no doubt in my mind that certain very valid constitutional rights have been violated," she said after Wednesday's two-hour visit. "I hope that ultimately he will be saved."
