

Mary's Peak Facilities Bring Conflict

PORTLAND (UPI)—The U.S. Forest Service and the Bonneville Power Administration indicated today they have different ideas about what should be done with Mary's peak, a 4,100-foot high mountain 20 miles west of Corvallis.

High Winds Spur Fires

PENDLETON (UPI)—High winds and drying weather conditions combined Monday to spur at least five separate fires in Eastern Oregon out of control for hours.

The fire swept up from the Umatilla River banks and into about 300 to 350 acres of ripe standing wheat. Ranchers and commercial firms dispatched trucks and men as the fire raged across a road, through a pea field and into another wheat field where it was finally brought under control.

Pendleton Grain Growers dispatched several trucks to help fight the fire and were aided by fire fighters of the Umatilla Indian Agency. Officials reported that two old unoccupied ranch houses were destroyed.

A smaller fire at the north city limits of Pendleton threatened a private home for awhile Monday. Starting in grass near Riverside, the blaze burned a garage and tool shed before the Pendleton fire department and volunteers could extinguish it.

In a housing addition on the south side of Pendleton, a grass fire roared through four acres of unused area before being brought under control.

Officials of the Ukiah Lumber company said a grass fire broke out about 2 p. m. and burned some 15 acres before it stopped. The fire, however, was turned away from standing timbers stacked at the lumber company office, just west of Pendleton.

Hawaiians To Elect Officials

HONOLULU (UPI)—The many-colored peoples of these Polynesian islands go to the polls today to elect their first representatives as the 50th state of the United States.

Enthusiasm for statehood was so high that Secretary of State Ed Johnson predicted 90 per cent of registered voters would cast ballots to elect a governor, lieutenant governor, two U. S. senators, a U.S. congressman and 62 state legislators.

Virtually every race and nation which has contributed to the population of the islands is represented on the ballot. The only contest between two Caucasians is that for governor. The appointed territorial governor, William F. Quinn, a Republican, and the territory's non-voting delegate to Congress, John A. Burns, a Democrat, are in a close race for that job.

A Hawaiian-born Japanese-American, Daniel K. Inouye, a Democrat, is expected to win election to the House of Representatives over Republican Charles H. Silva.

For Senate seat "A," Democrat Frank Fasi, a Connecticut-born businessman, is opposed by millionaire Chinese-American Hiram Fong, Republican, in what is expected to be another close race.

Former Gov. Oren Long, a Democrat, is expected to defeat Wilfred C. Tsukiyama, Republican, for Senat seat "B."

Candidates for lieutenant governor are Hawaii Kealoha, Republican, and Mitsuyuki Kido, a Japanese-American.

California Changes Rule Against Pets

BERKELEY, Calif. (UPI)—The University of California Monday reversed a hard-and-fast rule against pets so that Sharon England could "see."

Dean of Students William F. Shepard said the ban was waived so that Sharon's golden retriever might live with her in a university residence. Sharon, 19, has been blind since the age of 9.

"I may consider him a pet," Miss England said, "but he's really much more than that. He's my eyes."
