Rev. and Mrs. Owens, returned Nazarene missionaries to Korea, are on a furlough in the state, doing deputation work among churches of the denomination.
In Korea, they have been stationed at Seoul where they have been in charge of the Nazarene Bible School and have supervised the mission work.
The missionary message will describe the country and its people. Special songs will be sung and colored slides shown. Mrs. Owens plans to accompany her husband part of the time but will take separate deputation services also.
Both missionaries lived for many years in Kansas. They graduated from Bethany Nazarene College, Bethany, Okla., and pastored at Fairbury, Neb., before being assigned abroad by the Department of Foreign Missions.
Rev. and Mrs. Owens went to Korea in May, 1954. Their first child, a girl, was born there in 1957.
The Church of the Nazarene maintains some 450 full-time missionaries in 40 world areas.
