Sullivan Gives His Army Show Without Our Leader

By FRED DANZIG UPI Staff Writer NEW YORK (UPI) — Dialing ahead with his 6th annual Army talent show on CBS-TV Sunday night despite a serious handicap: Our Leader, Elvis, was busy elsewhere. But an impressionist, Jack Larson of Ft. Belvoir, Va., made the show legal by impersonating PFC Presley. While the hour was top-heavy with singers, the biggest disappointment was a civilian comedian, Henny Youngman. His "jokes" are ready to be mustered out, having reached the 30-year mark.

Tennis, anyone? The Davis Cup tennis matches from Forest Hills, N.Y., disrupted NBC-TV's Sunday schedule as Meet the Press, Chet Huntley Reporting and Midwestern Hayride were pre-empted to accommodate the extra-long matches between Australia and the U.S. Camera work during the Saturday and Sunday TV coverage was discreet and followed a sensible pattern: During action the full court was pictured; close-ups were reserved for the no-action spots. Jack Kramer and Billy Talbot, who shared the commentary, sometimes were guilty of too much "expertising" and simultaneous talking to the viewer's distraction. Incidentally, after Alex Olmedo defeated Aussie Rod Laver on Sunday, Ted Schroeder broke into Billy Talbot's interview with Alex to ask if the remarks could be shared by his radio listeners in Australia. When permission was granted, Schroeder delivered his congratulations to Olmedo and walked off. Australian listeners are probably waiting to hear Olmedo say a few words.

On NBC-TV Friday, the razor blade sponsor of the bruising Carmen Basilio-Gene Fullmer fight looked a little too sharp. They nicked some of the action in order to run commercials. Tab Hunter appeared on Dick Clark's ABC-TV show Saturday night to lip-synch his latest record and even his acting talent hid his embarrassment over the silliness of it all.

NBC and CBS presented the second parts of their running coverage of President Eisenhower's visit to Europe on Saturday and Sunday nights, respectively. NBC's hour-long news special grew duller and duller as one speaker after another agreed with the last. CBS half-hour offered fine videotapes of the President in London and Scotland, plus some meaningful commentary.

Teachers Eye Court

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI)— Two school teachers have asked, the U.S. District Court for an injunction to prevent the House Un-American Activities Subcommittee from turning information allegedly implicating some California teachers with Communism over to local school boards.

The subcommittee had subpoenaed more than 100 teachers last June for hearings to be held on the West Coast. However, the hearings were cancelled Aug. 21. The subcommittee said material about the teachers would be turned over to local agencies. The injunction, sought by Irma M. Tuominen, of South San Francisco, and Evelyn Schoenfeld, of Berkeley, named subcommittee investigator William Wheeler as the defendant. The complaint said the resolution creating the committee did not give it the power to distribute the information. The sole purpose of giving data to local boards would be to disgrace the teachers and cause them to be fired, it said.

A similar court action is pending in a federal court in Los Angeles.
