SALEM (UPI) — Additional na-tural gas to the Willamette Val-ley district for the winter season is imminent, the Public Utility Commission said today.

The Pacific Northwest Pipeline Corporation, sole supplier of na-tural gas to the state, plans to file within a few days a "short form" application with the Federal Power Commission for additional outlets in the area.

The line would be built from Camas, Wash., south and east of the present line of Northwest Na-Gas Company. Connections are planned at various points and eventually, gateways will be

Prineville, Redmond and Bend as well as Klamath Falls and the southern Oregon area with natural gas from Alberta, Canada,

Northwest Natural Gas Com-pany now serves the Willamette valley area as far south as Cor-vallis with natural gas and pro-vides butane gas to the Eugene-Springfield area.
