

# Steel Negotiators In Saturday Confab

NEW YORK (UPI)—Steel contract negotiators held their first Saturday meeting since the start of the 60-day strike, apparently in response to President Eisenhower's admonition against "half-hearted bargaining."

But there was no sign of a break in their deadlock.

"There has been no progress on any of the basic problems," Chief Federal Mediator Joseph F. Finnegan reported.

Eisenhower called on both sides earlier this week to reach an early settlement in the costly strike that has shut down nearly 90 percent of the nation's steel production. Finnegan said he believed the stopped-up negotiations were a result of the President's letter.

Nine key negotiators meanwhile were deciding whether to ask President Eisenhower to meet with them on ways of ending the strike.

Gov. J. Caleb Boggs of Delaware, chairman of the National Governors Conference, said the

nine-member executive committee would be polled early next week.

The governor of hard-hit Pennsylvania, David L. Lawrence, indicated he would press for a presidential fact-finding board if the meeting were held. President Eisenhower has rejected previous suggestions for appointment of a fact-finding board and the industry made it clear Friday that it still opposes such a move.

All 13 committees representing the United Steelworkers Union and the 12 major companies were meeting. Finnegan said Friday that the top-level negotiators appeared "satisfied with the way the subcommittees are working" on the problems.

But the federal mediator reported a shift by either side on the fundamental issues. The union is seeking a "substantial" wage increase, which the industry is resisting on the grounds that any rise in total labor costs would spark more inflation.

# Senate Kicks Civil Rights About As Adjournment Near

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The Senate, driving for congressional adjournment, has squared off for a sharp, session-ending civil rights fight.

Deadlocked Senate-House conferees also planned to try again to work out their differences over legislation to authorize higher interest rates on government savings bonds; the other major barrier to adjournment. The negotiators were under strong pressure to compromise but a solution did not appear likely.

House leaders, anxious to ad-

journal, kept their members on a standby basis to act on any legislation sent over from the Senate.

Key lawmakers said Congress probably couldn't clean up its work now but they forecast adjournment today or Tuesday. Tonight appeared the best bet.

The civil rights fight was over an attempt by some senators to tack an extension of the expiring Civil Rights Commission to a \$3,691,269,508 foreign aid money bill.

The amendment would extend the life of the controversial commission for two more years and put up \$500,000 for the group's expenses. The commission, which aroused southern ire with a series of anti-discrimination recommendations last week, will die Nov. 8 unless Congress acts.

Sen. Hubert H. Humphrey (D-Min.), one of the senators backing the rights proposal, said he was confident the amendment would be approved. He said it would be accompanied by an agreement from senate leaders to call up more sweeping civil rights legislation early next year, probably in late January or early February.

Southern senators were prepared to talk at length against the extension of the Civil Rights Commission. They have bitterly denounced the commission's recommendation that the federal government take over local election registration where necessary to end denials of voting rights.

# Rain, Dying Wind Aids Firefighters At Timber Blaze

CHILOQUIN (UPI)—Rain and dying winds Sunday night gave weary firefighters a long-awaited rest as the 10,000-acre timber fire north of here which claimed one life was termed "well under control."

Bill Crawford, fire dispatcher for the Klamath Agency here, said the fire fighters were "doing a good job of holding the fire lines" and a light rain had cut down the danger of the fire breaking out again.

An emergency call for more fire fighters was issued Sunday when high, gusty winds caused minor breakouts in several places.

**Victim's Body Found**

Clifford E. Daw, 32, Chiloquin bulldozer operator, perished Thursday when he was trapped by the spreading flames. His body was recovered Saturday.

Crawford said about 200 men and 16 bulldozers were still on the fire lines Sunday night.

The blaze was touched off Thursday when sparks from burning rubbish at the city dump here touched off nearby timber.

Officials have estimated more than 10,000 acres of rich Lodgepole and Ponderosa pine timber has been destroyed by the fire.
