

Food Buyers Find Supplies Of Most Staples Plentiful

The following guide to the nation's best food buys for the weekend of Sept. 19 was pre-pared for United Press International by the departments of Agriculture and Interior.

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Food shoppers will find many of their favorite items still in generally with cooler weather, some are getting scarcer and wearing food buys, from a national stand-point.

The heavier-type foods, though, remain still plentiful, such as pork, beef, and poultry. In pork, there's an excellent choice of carefully to find the thrifty buys smoked hams, bacon, sausage, in the markets this weekens, and chops. Broiler-fryers, turkeys and chops are still in excellent and prices are firm to slightly and most items. Fryer and hens are still in excellent supply, at most markets, and some stores are running specials on certain cuts of beef. Eggs and dairy products continue plentiful, and prices are very favorable. In fruits, housewives may choose new crop apples, grapes.
