Farm Price Support Over \$8 Billion

Farm News Roundup
WASHINGTON (UPI) — The government's investment in price-supported wheat, corn, cotton, and other surplus farm commodities totaled \$8,649,779,000 on June 30. The Agriculture Department said the investment was made up of \$6,200,267,000 in commodities owned outright by the Commodity Credit Corp. and \$2,448,512,000 in outstanding loans on farm products still held by producers. The investment on June 30 of last year was \$7,029,695,000.

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Agriculture Department said today stocker and feeder cattle and calves shipped into nine selected North Central states during August totaled 444,460 head, an increase of 22 per cent over August, 1958. Sheep and lambs shipped into the same states totaled 430,775 head, up 21 per cent from the 356,207 head shipped during August a year ago. The nine states were Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Michigan, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Iowa, South Dakota, and Nebraska.

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Foreign Agricultural Service said today exports of bananas in 1959 increased by more than 10 million bunches, or 7.3 per cent, over 1957. U.S. imports rose 3.8 per cent. The United States continued to be the most important consuming country. It took 44 per cent of all bananas last year. Western Europe took 41 per cent.

Central and South America continued to supply more than 80 per cent of the world's banana trade, with Ecuador alone shipping 22 per cent of the total.

GERMANS STUDY CRASH

BREMEN, Germany (UPI) — An investigation was started Friday in the crash of a West German jet fighter-bomber into a school building, narrowly missing 30 children at lunch in the cafeteria. None of the children was injured. The body of the pilot was found in the wreckage. Ike, Khrushchev To Occupy Same Cottage At Camp

WASHINGTON (UPI) — President Eisenhower, Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev and their foreign ministers will occupy the same cottage at Camp David, Md., this weekend, the White House disclosed. This will give them maximum opportunity for crucial cold war talks. Joining the President and Khrushchev at Aspen cottage, normally occupied by the President when he is at the Catoctin Mountain retreat, will be Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko and Secretary of State Christian A. Herter.

The White House announcement came as Eisenhower conferred with seven of his top advisers to help him prepare for the weekend meeting with Khrushchev. **LEGAL NOTICE**

Herter Acts To Free Yanks Held By Reds

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The State Department announced today that Secretary Christian A. Herter will meet Wednesday with relatives of five Americans still imprisoned in Communist China to assure them of continued efforts to seek their release.

President Eisenhower is expected to bring up the issue with Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev at their Camp David talks this weekend.

At least 158 Americans have been jailed or held under house arrest in China since the Communist regime was set up in 1949.

The U.S. and Chinese Communist representatives issued an "agreed announcement" Sept. 10, 1955 under which the Communists pledged to permit all Americans to return home "expeditiously."

However, no American prisoner has been released since Dec. 20, 1955, except at the expiration of his sentence.

One of the five prisoners is from the West. He is Robert Ezra McCann, a businessman whose family lives in Pasadena, Calif.

CHICAGO (UPI) — The Caterpillar Tractor Co. announced Tuesday the steel strike was forcing it to lay off 11,500 of its 40,000 employees Oct. 3. C. A. Woodley, executive vice president of the machinery firm, said that by Oct. 3 the company would be down to a bare minimum of steel supplies.
