

Give Up Hopes For New Farm Measures

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Democratic National Committee apparently has given up hope that the 80th Congress can write any new farm laws.

Its magazine, Democratic Digest, said "Any legislation offering substantial help to agriculture must, obviously, wait for another president."

Earlier this year, Democratic party leaders listed new farm legislation as one of their major goals. But in the first session of Congress President Eisenhower vetoed three farm bills, including price support measures for wheat and tobacco.

Democratic congressmen also felt that the threat of a veto kept many other farm bills off the House and Senate floors.

The Digest indicated that Democrats believe the same situation will prevail in the second session of congress which convenes next January.

Teamster Brass Ready To Approve Political Money

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Leaders of the Teamsters Union were reported ready today to approve a new, multi-million dollar political action program to fight their congressional enemies at the polls.

The program was one of a number of issues meeting of the union's general executive board starting this afternoon.

It envisions a national political fund of from one to two million dollars, volunteered by rank-and-file members, for lobbying and election campaign contributions.

Similar funds would be established at the state and local level by Teamsters' locals and joint councils.

The anticipated plunge into politics was a reaction to the stiff new labor reform law approved by Congress over the bitter opposition of Teamsters' President James R. Hoffa.

In other sessions, 30 lawyers were scheduled to tell the Teamsters' high command what they must do and what they can't do under terms of the new law.

Limey Scientists Say Pack A Day Not Harmful

BIRMINGHAM, England (UPI) — A team of Birmingham University scientists today reported smoking — especially a pack or more a day — may help health.

The scientists, led by Dr. Thomas McKeown, said research indicated cigarette smoking keeps blood pressure down. They said a survey of 1,000 men over 60 years of age revealed that the highest non-smokers had the highest blood pressures.

McKeown and his fellow scientists reported chain smokers had the lowest blood pressures among the men interviewed. These were men smoking 20 or more cigarettes a day.

Pipe smokers generally registered blood pressures between the non-smokers and the chain smokers.

McKeown's report said consumption of alcoholic beverages tended to raise blood pressure. However he said drinking does not raise blood pressure to the extent that smoking lowers it.
