Dip Cattle At Hindman's Wednesday

Wednesday at the Billy Hindman ranch, Hindman and the Oregon State College Extension Service will dip cattle in the systematic grub control material Coral.

Dr. Robert Goulding of the Experiment Station at Oregon State College and Chuck Gavin, county agent, will supervise the demonstration.

Hindman installed a metal dipping vat last spring and reported great success with it. As far as is known, there will be only three such demonstrations this year in the U.S. The Chemagro Chemical company is cooperating in furnishing the material. Trials in the state were very promising last year and the one in the county had 100 per cent control of the grub, also 100 per cent control of lice.

Anyone interested in seeing this demonstration or having any questions is welcome to come to the Hindman ranch and watch the cattle being treated. A large grub population should be present in cattle this year due to the tremendous and long length of the heel fly season.
