Oil issues with few exceptions moved higher. Rails had a somewhat better tone. Some of the metals advanced. Aircrafts ruled strong, tires mixed, and cameras sharply higher. Many specials rose 1 or 2 points.

**Stubblefield Twins Gaining Ground Following Operation**

**PORTLAND (UPI)**—Little Jeanett Kim Stubblefield, who rallied with what doctors called "miraculous gains" Thursday, and her Siamese twin sister Denett Linn today began the third day of their separated lives.

Doctors said today that Jeanett was still having some difficulty in breathing, even though Thursday afternoon she rallied from what doctors termed a "very low condition." Her condition remained nearly unchanged from the afternoon advisory.

However, her three-month-old twin Denett was strong enough Thursday night to take some diluted milk orally. She had been bottle-fed a solution of sugar, salt and water Thursday afternoon.

The twins were separated in a five-hour operation by four doctors in the University of Oregon Medical School hospital here Tuesday morning.

Jeanett began to show difficulty in breathing Wednesday and doctors performed a tracheotomy, inserting a silver tube in her windpipe so she would be able to breathe more easily.

**Still Critical**  
Even though Jeanett apparently passed a crisis yesterday and Denett drank her first milk since their trip to surgery, hospital attendants emphasized that both girls were still considered in critical condition and would remain so for some time.

A 24-hour watch over the infants will continue as long as necessary, hospital officials said.

The twin girls were born a month premature by Caesarian section to Mrs. James Stubblefield of Parma, Ida., on June 29 in Nyssa, Ore., hospital. The girls were flown here for special treatment shortly after birth.

**Death Sentence is Commuted At 'Last Minute'**

**SAN QUENTIN, Calif. (UPI)**—Harold Langdon never got to eat his last meal of fried chicken, chocolate cake and a vanilla milk shake.

Langdon was scheduled to die in the gas chamber today for kidnaping. He had ordered his last meal and was saying goodbye to his family Thursday night.

Then the news came that Gov. Edmund G. Brown had commuted his death sentence to life imprisonment.

Langdon said his prayers were answered.

"I thank you, Jesus," he said. He had waived a jury trial on charges of robbery and kidnaping and had been sentenced to death by a Los Angeles judge under terms of the state's Little Lindbergh Law.
