

U.S. Feeling Pinch From Steel Strike

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Government economists said today the steel strike stopped the nation's overall economic growth in the past three months and even may have caused a small setback.

They tentatively estimated that the total output of goods and services in July, August and September remained at the \$464,500,000, 000 annual rate posted in the previous three months. But some late figures on inventories may show that the economy actually slid backward from the April-May-June level.

Refrain From Guessing
These calculations were more pessimistic than earlier forecasts made on the assumption that the steel strike would not last more than two months. This is the 55th day of the strike.

The economists refrained from guessing how the economy might perform in the last three months of this year, other than to say it definitely would force ahead once the steel mills resumed operating.

Earlier confidence that steel and steel-using industries could make up for the strike with brisk October-November-December activity was missing. Some officials said that if President Eisenhower used the Taft-Hartley Act to send the 500,000 striking steel workers back to work for 80 days, the overall damage would be kept down.

Catch Up In 1960
Others said that even with use of the Taft-Hartley law some of the lost production could not be made up until early 1960.

A national production rate of 500 billion dollars a year, once considered an outside possibility for the close of this year, now appeared delayed at least until 1960.

Commerce Secretary Frederick H. Miller said in a New York speech the high rate would be achieved early next year "unless the effects of the prolonged steel strike upset the apple cart." Some economists said the 500 billion-dollar rate would not be reached before March.

First Polio Shot Most Important One, Salk Says

PITTSBURGH (UPI) — Dr. Jonas E. Salk, developer of the Salk polio vaccine, said Thursday any failure by the vaccine to provide protection can be blamed on "insufficient" strength of the first dose.

"The idea that there are 5, 10 or 15 per cent of the population who cannot respond to the vaccine is not so," Salk said.

The University of Pittsburgh scientist explained in a speech here that the first dose is "crucial" because it creates a barrier for subsequent inoculations. He said the strength of the first dose also affects the protection level that will be gained by a "booster shot."
