Herman, The Duck, Believes He's Dog; Dies Chasing Car

CHICAGO (UPI)—A psychologist said today an opportunity for a rare study in animal behavior died with Hermann, a duck that took up the ways of a dog and was killed while chasing and "barking" at a car.

Hermann was a phenomenon worthy of study, Dr. Theodore Schaefer of the University of Chicago said, because he was well along in a duck's life before he decided he wanted to be a dog or began to believe he was one.

Because of Hermann's premature death under the wheels of an automobile last month, Schaefer said, scientists will never know whether he might have been persuaded to be just plain fowl again.

Hermann the dog-like duck lived on the farm of Alvin Schneider near Oldham, S. D., and for the first year of his life he was like any other drake.

When Hermann's mate died, he attached himself to Schaefer's dog, Tony. He followed the dog everywhere, even after the annoyed pooch growled menacingly and seized the duck's head in his mouth as if to end the one-sided friendship then and there.

Gradually, Hermann began to behave like Tony.

When the dog chased cars, Hermann waddled madly after them, too. When the dog barked, Hermann tried to bark. When rain came down, Hermann huddled under shelter with Tony instead of enjoying the downpour.

Schaefer, attracted by a United Press International story about Hermann, went to the Schneider farm to see the duck while he was visiting in South Dakota recently. He spent several hours observing Hermann.

Schaefer said he was interested because Dr. Eckard H. Hess, one of his faculty colleagues at the University of Chicago, is a leading investigator of the phenomena of imprinting—when exposed to an animate or inanimate object early in life, "apes" like a normal newborn takes after its mother.

TELEVISION IN REVIEW:

'Untouchables' Adds Spice To Video With Authenticity

NEW YORK (UPI)—The Untouchables—no, Aunt Clemy, it's not about quiz show contestants—turned up as a brand-new hour-long ABC-TV crime series Thursday night after first seeing the light of our living rooms on CBS-TV last season.

The series will continue to deal with the exploits of federal agents, led by Eliot Ness, against the remnants of Al Capone's prohibition era mob in Chicago. As a two-parter on the Desilu Playhouse last season, the story dealt with how Ness sent Capone to prison on an income tax rap, and it was a resounding success. It had the professional touch, along with drama, authenticity and excitement. Happily, it still has all this.

Thursday night's episode, written by David Karp, directed by John Peyser and narrated by Walter Winchell, was called "The Empty Chair." The story picked up the mob's activities after Capone went away. One mobster, Frank Nitti, was shown trying to fill Capone's chair by gunning down a couple of would-be competitors as they sat in barber chairs. But Jake Guzik, played by Nehemiah Persoff told Nitti he was going about it in the wrong way. "A gun can't think," he said. "Jake substituted brains for a brain. He set up a business-like one-for-all, all-for-one operation and was able to frustrate Ness, who tried to stir up an intra-mob feud. However, Ness finally caught Guzik by turning Guzik's niece into a deputy agent.

One sidelight to the simple plot was the way Guzik and Ness understood each other's stratagems. At one point, after his effort to start a feud failed, Ness, played by Robert Stack, said, "The kennel is quiet. The dogs are eating out of the same bowl." He had his enemies tagged all along. "I enjoyed the show because it was thoroughly professional. Done in documentary style, with Winchell's narration giving it a boost, the episode contained impressive camera work, crisp, realistic dialogue, authentic sets. I'd give the acting honors to Persoff. Despite a tendency to move his jaw too much Persoff took command of his scenes and was a powerful performer all through the show. Good jobs were turned in by Nicholas Georgiade, Bruce Gordon and Robert Stack. It was a fine start, in fact, this one adds up to the best of ABC-TV's new batch.

The Channel Swim: Charles Laughton will narrate and star in a 90-minute presentation that includes highlights from Shakespeare's "A Midsummer Night's Dream." The program, to be taped at Stratford-on-Avon, England, will be shown as an NBC-TV Startime special on a date to be announced.

Vice President Nixon and his mother, Hannah, will be special guests on Art Linkletter's NBC-TV special, "The Secret World of Kids," on Tuesday, Oct. 27. The Marquis family of trained chimpanzees, a triumphant feature on Jack Benny's last TV special, again will be featured when Benny presents his Saturday, Nov. 7 special on CBS-TV. Abbe Lane sits in as a guest panelist on ABC-TV's Dick Clark's world of talent Sunday, Oct. 25. CBS-TV says the Saturday, Oct. 24 premiere episode of its new Mr. Lucky series, starring John Vivyan, cost more than \$100,000 to produce, making it probably the most expensive half-hour film show ever to hit TV. Sid Caesar's Wednesday, Dec. 2 special on CBS-TV will feature Audrey Meadows, Jose Ferrer, Marge and Gower Champion and Connie Francis. Tentative title: "The Marriage... Handle With Care."
