**Men Into Space Soon, Say Soviets**

WASHINGTON (UPI)—A Russian scientist has predicted that "pilots and scientific workers" will be sent into space aboard recoverable satellites "in the near future."

Space authorities here would not be surprised if the Russians sent up a manned satellite next year. The United States does not expect to put a man in space before late 1961.

The Soviet prediction was made by Prof. V. Dobranavov, doctor of physicomathematical sciences, Moscow, in an article distributed by the Commerce Department's office of technical services.

**Foresees Other Actions**

Discussing Lunik II, which he said was fully guided and tracked all the way to the moon Sept. 12-13, Dobranavov foresaw "other far-reaching actions."

"In particular," he said, "the creation of controlled and recoverable artificial earth satellites in the near future is already fully possible. It is also already possible to dispatch pilots and scientific workers in such satellites for training them for distant inter-planetary flights."

Officials in charge of the U.S. manned satellite program, Project Mercury, concede that Russia may well be the first nation to put a man in space.

**Disclose Astronauts Names**

In Moscow, the names of Russia's first three prospective riders to the moon were revealed in two magazines today.

The magazines "Soviet Union" and "Ogonek" broke a long Soviet silence on the nation's high altitude training program with articles dealing with simulated space flights in which the blood of prospective astronauts was made to "boil."

Named as Russia's first astronauts were Ivan Kachur, Alexei Grachev, and Alexei Belokonev.

The articles failed to answer the big question of when Russia will attempt to fling a human into space in a rocket or possibly a space exploration plane such as the American X-15.

It had been reported in the West that the Soviet Union had 3 to 20 astronauts in training. The articles published today did not say whether the three astronauts named were the only ones in training.
