### 'Make It Yourself With Wool' Contest To Be Held Saturday

"Make It Yourself With Wool" contestants will vie for honors at the contest Saturday in the Sacajawea Hotel. This will be for all contests of Union and Wallawa Counties.

Mrs. Verna Pumpfrey, district director of Union, says that the contest sponsored by the Wool Bureau of New York City and the Oregon Wool Growers' Auxiliary, is open to all girls between 18 and 22 years of age. Garments are to be made of wool.

Winners in the two divisions will receive all expenses paid trip to the state contest, held in Portland Nov. 3 and 4. The two high ranking girls at state will in turn go on to the National contest at San Antonio, Texas, in January. The two national winners will receive trips to Europe.

The junior division is ages 14 through 17, and the senior division is ages 18 through 22 years. In addition to these divisions at the District contest at La Grande, there will be a division for girls 13 through 16, who have made skirts or jumpers of 100% wool, competition on district level only. Anyone eligible who has made a wool garment since November 1958, please contact Mrs. Pumpfrey at Union, immediately.

Contestants are to enter garments before 9 a.m. Saturday at the Sacajawea Hotel. Instruction and help will be given in modeling their garment by a former model. A hair styling and make-up demonstration will be given during the morning. A 12:30 luncheon will be held at the hotel for contestants. Other interested persons or family may attend the luncheon for \$1.25 by making reservations with Mrs. Pumpfrey at Union.
