The Colossus of Rhodes, a bronze statue of Helios, sun god, was about 105 feet tall and stood on the island of Rhodes. It was made from the melted bronze weapons and instruments left behind by the Macedonian army retreating from the siege of Rhodes in 305 B.C. After requiring 12 years to finish, the statue only stood until 224 B.C., when it was destroyed by a quake.

Tell How Soviets Tried To 'Tap' Nixon In Moscow

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Soviet officials insisted on redecorating the Moscow residence of Vice President Richard M. Nixon prior to his visit last July in an apparent effort to plant eavesdropping devices.

The Russian tactics were disclosed today after Russell Langelle, ousted U.S. security officer in Moscow, told a news conference that the Soviets tried to spy on Nixon. Langelle said Monday he thwarted the Red espionage efforts.

According to reliable sources, Soviet officials insisted on installing two new chandeliers in Spassko House, the U.S. Embassy residence where Nixon stayed. This was described as subterfuge to plant hidden eavesdropping equipment.

The sources said the Soviets also tried to rig the telephones in Spassko House in such a manner that they would become microphones as soon as they were placed in their cradles at the end of a call.

Nixon's office had no comment on the reports.

Radio Moscow Heard

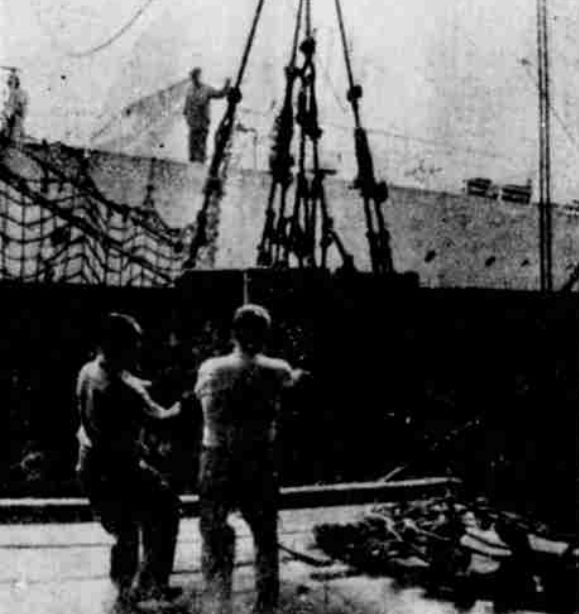
LONDON (UPI)—Radio Moscow, in a broadcast heard here, today gave favorable reviews to two new films which went on view in Moscow Tuesday.

'Give-Away Plot Foiled; Pile Now Worth \$400,000

NEW YORK (UPI) — Eugene F. Suter Jr. had \$400,000 to spend today but he wouldn't have it if he had been permitted to give it away in 1955 as he tried to do.

Suter, 27, petitioned the court Monday to let him handle the legacy from his father, a manufacturer of permanent wave machines. Supreme Court Justice Henry Clay Greenberg declared him competent to manage his own affairs.

Suter gave away the first \$36,000 in income from the legacy when he was a student at Yale University in 1953. He said he gave it up on "moral and political" grounds.
