

# Nikita Impressed By U.S. Living, May Push Products

WASHINGTON (UPI)—A Russian housewife in Soviet Katakhs soon may be able to buy a longed-for ironing board and a few clothes hangers as a result of Premier Nikita Khrushchev's visit to the United States.

At least that's the view of some American experts on Russian affairs.

They said today they believed that the new Soviet drive to increase the quantity and quality of consumer goods stemmed in large part from the fact that Khrushchev was greatly impressed by the American standard of living.

There is a feeling here that the Russian public's intense interest in the American exhibit in Moscow last summer also helped convince the Kremlin that it would be wise to make available more and better household goods and appliances and wearing apparel.

Whatever the reason, the fact is that the Soviet government has undertaken a strenuous new drive on the consumer goods front since Khrushchev returned to Moscow.

The demand is not only for more articles but higher quality. There's harsh criticism in the official press of some of the antiquated and inefficient items being produced by state industry.

The Soviet government has announced that the production of "cultural, everyday and household goods" in Russia is to be increased from a wholesale value of 45,500,000,000 rubles in 1958 to 57,900,000,000 in 1960 and 64,600,000,000 in 1961.

It has ordered trade organizations to "systematically find out the demands of the people"—apparently a Soviet effort at the market analysis which for decades has been standard merchandizing practice in the capitalist West.

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### 1959 Worst Year For Polio Since Salk Vaccine

PORTLAND (UPI)—The State Board of Health today declared 1959 the worst polio year in Oregon since Salk vaccine was pressed into use in 1955.

Toll of the polio epidemic rose to 154 with nine more cases reported last week. Of the total 120 have been paralytic. Last year, only 34 cases had been reported, 21 paralytic.

The board also reported that Oregon has reached an all-time high in influenza cases with the 1959 total standing at 52,622 cases. Some 462 new cases were reported last week.

An epidemic of infectious hepatitis appeared to be slowing down, according to the weekly report. Seventeen new cases were reported last week, boosting the year's total to 701, fourth highest in Oregon history.

Douglas county, apparent center of the outbreak, reported two new cases to up the yearly total to 133.



### Nicaraguan Guardsmen Route Invading Unit

MANAGUA, Nicaragua (UPI)—Nicaraguan national guardsmen routed a band of invaders from Honduras, killing or capturing 14, including five Cubans, it was announced Thursday night.

The communique issued by the national guard did not say when or where the reported clash took place.

It said the government forces killed two Cubans, one Honduran and one Salvadoran. Another Cuban was wounded but escaped, the national guard said.
