

# Syracuse Old Pros Romp Over Celtics

The "old pro" scoring punch of Delph Schayes and George Yardley threatens to turn the National Basketball Association's Eastern Division race into a battle royal. Schayes, who holds the all-time NBA scoring record, tallied 32 points and Yardley poured in 21 Wednesday night as the Syracuse Nationals romped over the Boston Celtics, 138-103.

In other games, Detroit whipped Cincinnati, 110-93, and New York edged Minneapolis, 106-105. Syracuse, winning its fifth straight game, set an all-time club field goal high of 58 baskets and climbed to within three games of the division-leading Celtics. Philadelphia is in second place, a game and a half behind Boston.

Schayes scored seven of his 14 baskets in the opening period as the Nationals surged to a 42-20 lead. The closest Celtics came was an 11-point deficit midway in the third period. Sam Jones, who has blossomed into a high-scoring backcourt man, led Boston with 28 points.

The Pistons handed Cincinnati its seventh straight defeat as they held Jack Twyman to only 15 points. The Royal scoring ace fouled out early in the fourth quarter. Rookie Bailey Howell led the Detroit attack with 27 points. New York withstood a determined Laker rally in the fourth

quarter to gain back-to-back victories for the second time this season. The Knicks, who at one time held a 21-point lead, were paced by Willie Naulls' 23 points and Kenny Sears' 21. Elgin Baylor was high for Minneapolis with 20 points.

## Bob Allison Honored As AL Rookie

BOSTON (UPI) — Young Bob Allison, "Mr. Inside" of the Washington Senators, couldn't be blamed today if he greeted the news of being named the American League Rookie of the Year for 1959 with mixed emotions.

The 1958 AL rookie award went to Albin Pearson, who lost his center field job last spring — to Allison. Pearson has since been traded to the Baltimore Orioles.

There was little competition in the voting announced here Wednesday. The 25-year-old Allison garnered 18 of the 24 votes by a committee of the nation's sports writers.

The 6-foot 3-inch, 210-pound Allison picked up his nickname from smashing line drive homers in spacious Griffith Stadium in Washington.

Allison played in the shadow of Killebrew's slugging feats most of the season. But he wound up his first year in the majors with 33 home runs, led his team in four departments and led the league in triples.
