C-C Supports Crusading Medic

SHERMAN OAKS, Calif. (UPI) —The Sherman Oaks Chamber of Commerce today threw its support behind efforts to obtain a painted crosswalk across a heavily traveled street where a dentist was cited for painting the walk himself.

Dr. Louis J. Friedman, 42, the crusading dentist, was formally charged Tuesday with two motor vehicle code violations and two city code violations for painting the crosswalk Sunday morning.

The citation, issued by Assistant City Attorney Donald Mowal, ordered Friedman to appear to plead Dec. 15.

Friedman said he decided to paint the walk with a broom and white paint after two petitions signed by businessmen in the area had failed to bring results. He said they had been trying to get the city to paint in the crosswalks for two years.

Chamber of Commerce officials, led by President Ted Levey, said not only would they press to have the city continue the painting but would go further and demand a red light at the crossing.

Would Kill Income Tax

NEW YORK (UPI) — A reversal of America's way of economic thinking and the elimination of all personal income taxes by the end of 1962 is the ambitious goal of Raymond E. Umbaugh, a 39-year-old, self-made millionaire aircraft manufacturer.

Umbaugh, in an interview today, said this is the way to counteract Russian Premier Khrushchev's warning that he will "bury" us, economically.

The best way to meet this threat, according to Umbaugh, would be to "take the fat out of government and give it back to the taxpayer." He emphasized that a government dedicated to a more productive America through individual incentives is "a must for survival."

Umbaugh and five other wealthy businessmen have formed an organization called Americans for Economic Freedom.

"What we need in the United States is the stabilization of the dollar," Umbaugh declared. "A return to economic freedom will stabilize the dollar."

Umbaugh said that 1960 is "the year of decision." With that in view, his organization plans to work for delegates to the Democratic and Republican national conventions who will support the principles of the AEF. He said he hopes to have 50 per cent of the delegates in favor of his plan.
