 The Black Sea is different from most seas. There are almost no tides. In the Black Sea all forms of fish and marine animals are absent below a depth of 480 feet (it is more than 6,000 feet deep) because of the presence of poisonous hydrogen sulphide gas. Despite the salty undercurrent that comes into the Black Sea through a narrow outlet to the Mediterranean Sea, it is only half as salty as the Mediterranean because several great rivers supply fresh water which dilutes the salt.

PORTLAND (UPI) — Interior Secretary Fred Seaton Wednesday told Sen. Richard Neuberger (D-Ore.) that the Oregon Dunes near Florence "merits special consideration as a national shoreline."
 The Oregon senator said Seaton informed him that the Budget Bureau has advised enactment of Neuberger's proposed legislation would be in accord with the program of the President.
 Neuberger said this indicates that Eisenhower's administration is friendly to his Oregon Dunes National Seashore park plan.
 Seaton set down his views in a report compiled for the Senate Interior Committee on various bills regarding establishment of national seashore parks.
 The secretary's report recommended against authorization of the Oregon Dunes as a national park in separate legislation, and requested instead, passage of Neuberger's bill, introduced at the request of the administration, to sanction three parks, the senator said.
