Hunting, Angling Require New License New Years Day

Sportsmen intending to hunt or fish on New Year's day or immediately after had better get their hunting and fishing licenses for 1960. Anglers and hunters are urged to purchase the new licenses as soon as possible so they won't be caught short Jan. 1 when a new license will be required.

New licenses are now available at all license agents throughout the state.

Steelhead and salmon anglers are also reminded that if they intend to angle for these game fish during the coming year an additional \$1 will have to be tacked up for the 1960 salmon-steelhead license. This is a new law passed by the last legislature.

All persons 14 years of age or over who angle for steelhead and salmon are required to have in

the possession the \$1 salmon and steelhead license in addition to their regular angling license.

The license is identical to the punch card used in previous years and will be good through the calendar year. All salmon and steelhead taken which are 20 inches in length or over must be recorded on the card. This punch card must be returned to the game commission whether any fish were taken or not at the end of the calendar year.

Landowners, who required no license in the past to angle on their own property, now require the \$1 license in addition to the regular license if they plan to fish for salmon or steelhead. No license will be required by landowners if they angle for other game fish.

All monies obtained from the sale of the special license will be used by the game commission for salmon and steelhead research and management.

High School Conservation Tests

Oregon students will get an opportunity to show their knowledge of the principles of natural resource conservation, soils, water, plant life and wildlife in a soon to be administered test.

These questions and many more may soon be answered with a random sample of Oregon high school students scheduled to participate this winter in a pilot project aimed at testing their conservation reasoning. The test is designed to determine understanding of conservation principles and at which grade level students begin to develop such understanding.

The State Department of Education and the Oregon Game Commission are cooperating in the administration of the test, designed by the Conservation foundation of New York and the Educational Testing Service of New Jersey, in the Oregon pilot study.

High schools of all sizes and in all parts of the state have been selected for participation. Only a portion of the total enrollment in each school will be given the test.

Between 4000 and 5000 tests are being given in the state, not more than 120 students, from each

school, as part of the validity study to determine national norms in conservation reasoning. Additional tests are planned in other states.
