Hates British Bureaucrats, Becomes Yank

PINE BUSH, N.Y. (UPI)—"How they can tax me 130 per cent of my gross income is incomprehensible."

With these words, successful British author Gerald Kersh explained why he will become a U.S. citizen.

"I love England and honor the Queen," said Kersh, who has written 5,000 articles, 3,000 short stories and 27 novels.

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His wife said one of his stories had been taxed twice—the United States wanted 40 per cent and Great Britain asked for 90 per cent.

Despite the complaints of Americans about high taxes, Kersh said things are better here than in England "to some extent."

"The bureaucrats in Great Britain have made success in the arts an offense punishable by bankruptcy," he said.
