WOMAN AUTHOR ON 'MARRIAGE' DIVORCES HUSBY  
LONDON (UPI) — Mrs. Sylvia Duncan, author of "How To Be A Better Wife," was a divorcee Tuesday from her husband who walked out for good last September.

But she denied failure to practice what she preached in her 1953 book on how to make happy marriage and in her former newspaper column where she gave advice to the lovelorn.

She divorced her husband, Peter Duncan, a television executive, on grounds of adultery with Joyce Bullen who is a television producer.

"I did everything I possibly could to try to save our marriage," she said. "I more than carried out all the advice I have so often given to others" in the column she once wrote.

Mrs. Duncan wiped a tear from her cheek and said, "divorce is an admission of failure and defeat."

Mrs. Duncan, who won custody of their daughter, said, "I still stand by every word I have written. I put the children first and did not enter the petition until a week after my daughter's 16th birthday."

She decided she could keep his disappearance quiet no longer. She told her story to newsmen. "I hope he'll read something and just call us and talk to the children," she said. "Maybe we can talk to him and make him come home."

She said if he had gone any place she thought he would go to Florida. He liked Daytona Beach and Miami. Her main concern was the children.

"I can't get them to see Santa Claus. They just want to see their daddy," she said.

### Russ Missile Submarines?

LONDON (UPI) — The Soviet Union already may have submarines armed with nuclear-headed guided missiles on active service, an authoritative reference work said today.

"Jaw's All The World's Aircraft" said there were "persistent reports" these missile craft are now part of the Soviet fleet of 500 submarines built up to sever the Atlantic lifeline between Europe and North America in the event of war.

The 1960 edition of the reference work said the Russian counterpart of the American Polaris missile, also designed to be fired from submarines under the water, is being completed.

There are two versions of the missile at the moment. Goldil is believed to be a 23,000-gal liquid-propellant missile fired from a chamber towed by a submarine. It has a range of 400 miles.

Golem-2 is believed to be a development of the Soviet T2 intermediate range ballistic missile, used by the army. This is a two-stage liquid propellant weapon 100 feet long, with a firing weight of 122,000 pounds, and range of 1,000 miles.
