

# Tourney Title Goes To NY's Manhattan U.

PORTLAND (UPI)—Manhattan of New York won the first annual City of Roses Invitational hockey Saturday night with a 6-1 win over University of Portland.

The Jaspers met the talled Pilots' heads and used battle and good defense in nabbing the title. Bob Mealy led Manhattan with 25 points but did not score a point in the last 13 minutes of action. Bill Garner had 22 points for the Pilots.

The taller Pilots outrebounced Manhattan, 64-44, but couldn't get past the Jaspers' tight checking man for many defense enough times to pull the game out.

Mealy and Dougherty were selected to the all-tournament team from Manhattan.

# Harv Kuenn Wins Loop Swat Title

CHICAGO (UPI)—Harvey Kuenn, possibly the finest natural hitter in the American League, finally owns that elusive batting crown he has eyed for six years.

It was made official today when league averages released here showed the Detroit outfielder was far and away the leading hitter with a .353 average last season.

Until this year, the 29-year-old Kuenn had placed among the top six hitters in the circuit for five of six previous seasons, but he never was able to win the title.

This year, though, he won going away, slugging out 198 hits in 561 official times at bat to beat teammate Al Kaline, who was runner-up with 327.

Pete Samuels of the Red Sox would up third behind Kaline with a .314 average and the top five was rounded out by Nellie Fox of the White Sox, who batted .296, and Minnie Minoso, recently traded by the Indians to the White Sox, who hit .302.

The other three players who managed to hit .300 or better were Bobby Richardson of the Yankees, .301, and Bill Tuttle of the Athletics and Gene Woodling of the Orioles, each .300.

## DUCKS, OSC WHIP COURT OPPONENTS

EUGENE (UPI)—Oregon's basketball team opens a two-game series with San Jose State here tonight. The Webfoots ran their season's record to 4-1 Saturday night by downing Colorado State 72-66.

Sophomores Glenn Moore and Charlie Warren paced the Duck victory as Coach Steve Belko's lads staved off two Colorado State rallies.

The one-two sophomore punch Ducks combined for 44 points. Moore was over his 20 point per game average with 24 points and Warren had 20.

Oregon had a slim 29-28 half-time lead but with eight minutes left had padded it to 51-39. Then Colorado State started moving as Chuck Newcombe got red-hot and pulled his team to 64-60 with 3 1/2 minutes left.

However, Newcombe could get

no help from his teammates and CSU could get no closer than four points the remainder of the game. For the game Newcombe hit 13 of 21 shots from the field and hit on his last seven shots from the field.

He wound up as high scorer for the game with 29 points.

PORTLAND (UPI)—Oregon State goes after its second basketball victory in a row over Nebraska here tonight in an inter-sectional game at the PI pavilion.

The Beavers shaded the Cornhuskers 63-60 Saturday night in Corvallis, although Nebraska staged a rally in the last four minutes which almost pulled the game out.

Herschell Turlier tied it up for the visitors at 54-54. The game was tied twice more before Jim Woodland hit a jump shot to give OSC the lead, 60-58.

The Cornhuskers trailed at halftime by 10 points—37-27. Turner and Al Maxey topped the visitors' scoring with 17 and 15 points respectively.

Jay Carty had 22 for the Beavers and Woodland had 17.

Nebraska fired at a .333 clip from the field on 21 of 63 shots and the Beavers hit .334 on 25 of 74.
