TOKYO (UPI) — With the approach of New Year's, Japan's biggest holiday and drinking season, a Japanese newspaper today published seven drinking rules for women.

"We do not think drinking is bad—but we don't like the sight of drunken women," said the newspaper Sankai Shimbun. "Of course, the women would like to hit back and say "how about those drunken men."

"But women when drinking must be careful to preserve their feminine traits. Compared to men, the drinking history of women is short, indeed, and there have been a lot of embarrassing incidents."

# Personal Income For Oregonians At High Figure

NEW YORK (UPI) — The current issue of Business Week estimated that total personal income in Oregon for 1959 will be \$3,838,000,000. This represents an increase of 7.8 per cent over 1958 personal income in Oregon of \$3,557,000,000.

Section 4 provides, generally, that unpatented mining claims located after July 23, 1955 shall not be used for purposes other than prospecting, mining, or processing operations, or uses reasonably incident thereto; that such claims located after July 23, 1955 shall not be used for purposes other than prospecting, mining, or processing operations, or uses reasonably incident thereto; that such claims shall be subject to the right of the United States to manage and dispose of the vegetative surface resources thereof and to manage other surface resources thereof; and that, except to the extent required for mining operations and uses reasonably incident thereto or to provide clearance for such operations or uses, claimants of such claims shall not use or dispose of vegetative or other surface resources thereof; and that, except for clearance for such purposes, any permitted severance or removal of timber must be in accordance with sound principles of forest management. Said section 4 also provides that any use of the surface of any such mining claim by the United States, its permittees or licensees, shall be such as not to endanger or materially interfere with the prospecting, mining, processing, or reasonably incident uses by the mining claimant.
