Scientists Toy With Scheme To Eliminate Light

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Navy scientists have been toying with the idea of eliminating night. This could be done, they say, if man were able to create a thick layer of dust in a region far out from the earth.

The layer of dust would be like an area of extremely fine particles about 10 miles in depth, located 35,000 miles above that planet.

Drs. Herbert Friedman and James Purcell of the Naval Research Laboratory said there is no night on Saturn because of the continual brightness of the ring.

Friedman said it might take millions of tons of dust to create an effective ring.

He mentioned that the eruption of Mt. Krakatau on a Pacific island in 1883 spewed forth many millions of tons of dust that vis-

With the \$60,000 he had left after taxes, Cloos realized his dream to buy a small hotel, a converted mansion in nearby Guthrie Station.

He married a second time and settled down as proprietor of the Parkland Hotel.

But business did not prosper. Monday his wife heard a shot in an upstairs bed room. She found Cloos dead and authorities ruled it was a suicide.

He was despondent over "money worries," police said.

The star of TV's "M Squad" was talking about whether he will be unemployed next month.

Despite their wealth, participations deals and fan following, stars are chattels of numerous individuals and institutions—sponsors, studios, networks, agents and producers. They are never "free" to guide the future.

Marvin, ruggedly shrewd and cynical, owns half his "M Squad" program, but still does not know if the show will be cancelled.

Oregon Payroll Taxes Going Up

SALEM (UPI)—As of Friday—the first of the year—Oregon payroll taxes will go up and employers of only one person will come under the state unemployment compensation law.

The 1959 Legislature made the changes in the law.

Employers pay payroll taxes now on the first \$3,500 of employee income but after Jan. 1 the first \$3,800 of income will apply.

The unemployment trust fund is expected to be increased by about one million dollars per year by the change. Also, 10,000 employers will come under the unemployment pay system with the advent of the one-employee statute.
