PASADENA, Calif.—Dr. Harold Brown, of the University of California's Livermore Laboratory, indicating he would like to analyze more Soviet nuclear blasts before judging the efficiency of underground detection techniques. Fleming Asking For More Control In Banning Foods

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Health Secretary Arthur S. Flemming said that he will ask Congress to give him authority to move more swiftly in banning foods containing cancer-causing agents. He said he will also ask for power to permit the use of cancer-causing chemicals in animal feeds if their use does not produce residues in human food. Flemming reported at a news conference that no traces of a pesticide have turned up in milk recently tested. In 1958, traces of the chemical were found in milk in 11 cities.

Flemming said the proposal to permit use of some cancer-producing chemicals in animal feed was aimed specifically at stilbestrol. This is a synthetic female hormone which Flemming recently banned from use in poultry because it left a residue in chickens.

When the chemical is fed to beef cattle and sheep, Flemming said, it leaves no residue in the meat and poses no hazard to humans.

Hong Kong Correspondent Missing Inside Red China

TOKYO (UPI)—United Press International Vice President for Asia Ernest Hobercht announced today that staff correspondent Yim Yuen Lo of the UPI Hong Kong bureau has been missing inside Communist China since July. Hobercht said Yim left Hong Kong for Canton July 19 on an assignment to interview William Downey, who was then in China visiting his brother John, one of five Americans still imprisoned by the Peiping government.

Hobercht said all attempts to locate Yim through the International Red Cross had failed as had inquiries through other channels, including direct cables to the government in Peiping. It was presumed Yim had been detained by the Communist Chinese, Hobercht said.

On the evening of Sunday July 19 Yim placed a telephone call to Wendell S. Merick, Hong Kong bureau manager for United Press International, telling him of difficulties in reaching Downey. That was the last direct word the Hong Kong bureau had from him.

On Tuesday July 21 UPI received a brief cryptic cable signed by "Ivyman," a nickname of Yim's, saying in part, "marathon due."

On Wednesday, three days after Yim began his trip, the UPI Hong Kong bureau received a message reportedly smuggled in from Red China reading: "tell boss at UPI can't leave for a while."

Yim, who often calls himself "Bill," is a 25-year-old Chinese citizen who was born in Shanghai. He went to Hong Kong with his parents when he was 3 years old and lived there since. He joined UPI in April, 1958 after working two years for Reuters.
