Hank Favored In TV Battle

CHICAGO (UPI) — Hard hitting Henry Hank, the world's third ranked middleweight, expects to meet a "runner" and not a puncher in light-heavyweight Sixto Rodriguez tonight, so he's preparing for a "track meet."

Hank was a solid favorite to whip Rodriguez, ranked fourth among the 175 pounders, despite the difference in weight for their nationally televised bout.

Hank has much more experience, and a record indicating a much more solid punch, than his opponent, The Detroit battler, who has a four fight winning streak, has won 40 bouts, 28 of them by knockout, lost 10 and drawn one.

Rodriguez, a native of Puerto Rico, has had only 28 fights, winning 24 with two losses and two draws.

Warriors-Boston Grab Wins

 Scoring 40 points in a game is almost an average night's work for Wilt Chamberlain.

Chamberlain, who has accounted for a fantastic 2,233 points so far in his rookie campaign, collected 44 Tuesday night as the Philadelphia Warriors swept their nine-game season's series with the Cincinnati Royals, 117-112.

In other games, Boston whipped Minneapolis, 130-122. New York surprised Syracuse, 125-111, and St. Louis defeated Detroit, 111-104.

The Celtics used a balanced attack to overcome Elgin Baylor's 40-point performance for the Lakers. Bill Sharman led the Celts with 26 points. Bob Cousy had 24, Frank Ramsey 22 and Bill Russell 20.

More Trouble Brews In Olympic Village

SQUAW VALLEY, Calif. (UPI) — The most monumental foul-up in Olympic history today shattered the peace and serenity of scenic Squaw Valley, site of the 1950 Winter Games opening Thursday.

If there was anything right, it was being kept secret and criticism was being heaped on the U.S. organizers of the games in an increasing flow of complaints.

It wasn't so serious that the actual games were in jeopardy, but it had reached the stage where most everyone was unhappy about one thing or another.

Worse Not Better
 "There's no excusing the poor conditions here," said a high member of the U.S. Olympic Committee, who asked that his name not be used. "We figured the organizing committee would do a good job for they had the North American skiing championships here a year ago and we all figured that would prove a good trial run. And given then plenty of time to correct mistakes and set everything right."

Facilities Crowded
 "Nothing has been done to keep half of the ice from the main area from melting under the winter sun, preventing athletes from using half of the arena from about 11 a.m. on each day."

At first all of the complaints were hushed off as one of those things that usually occur in big international sports events. The early complaints of the foreign officials and athletes were discounted on the grounds that they would complain no matter what the conditions.

But when U.S. athletes and officials joined the parade some figured that maybe changes would be made for Uncle Sam was talking now. But that didn't help either.
