 Jones, riding aboard Swamp Donkey, briefly took the top spot with an 83-point ride as the bull jumped and kicked while spinning left. Hill then one-upped Jones. Hill, riding Banana Man, posted the winning score of 85.5 as his bull started left, then spun right, then spun left again.  
 Wyatt Covington, the Friday night leader, finished third with 80.5 points. Daltee Mason was fourth with 79.5 points — one of four rides of 79 points or better Saturday night.  
 Russell Cardoza was the overall champion in steer

roping with a combined time of 30.3 seconds on two steers. Pake Sorey was second overall with a time of 32.5 seconds.  
 Dean Hanson was the first-round winner in 13.7 seconds ahead of both Cardoza and Tom Sorey (14.0 seconds each). Jason Stewart (15.0 seconds) edged

Pake Sorey (15.4) to win the second round. Earlier in the evening, Jaiden Hutchins recorded the lone qualified ride in the miniature bulls with a score of 59 points. Jayden Herrera, who won both Thursday with a 68-point ride and Friday with 67, was the overall champion in mini bulls.

 love, maybe a slight redesign of some holes, it's going to be a world class place to play disc golf."

Ballew shared a similar view. "It's a little more prehistoric, but I see Morgan Lake being a top-level course once tee pads get put in," he said.

For Kennewick, Washington disc golfer David Morse, playing Morgan Lake, which he called a tough course, was part of the draw. He's also believes the tournament has a bright future. "It's got the potential to be a big tournament in Eastern Oregon, for sure," Morse said. As for AnDyke, she was encouraged by what she saw

over the weekend and also optimistic about the future of not only the new course but of the tournament. "With what we do being hooked up with our sponsors, and then our connection with Oregon State Parks and other entities, we are going to do everything we can to help push and help see that course grow," she said.
