Become the miracle someone is praying for

e do not have to look very far to find someone who needs a miracle. Many are suffering some type of crisis like health problems, conflicts with their children and grieving over a loss, finances, marriage issues and on and on.

When difficult situations are presented, we become sympathetic, but how often do we consider that God may have brought these individuals to our attention so that we can intervene and help meet their

Instead of just discussing the situation and having pity, maybe we can become the miracle they are praying for. James 2 talks about the difference between having faith without becoming involved and literally demonstrating our faith by our willingness to reach out and help someone.

Have you ever been discouraged or in trouble and you cried out for God to please send somebody to help? If someone responded, you knew they were a Godsend, right? If no one came, we wonder if someone was called upon but was too busy or maybe simply did not want to take the time or finances to become involved.

I believe this reveals more about what life is really about than we care to think about. Many people are convinced they are free to live however they want, and I can understand this point of view for a non-Christian. However, for those who

explains that we are called to radically change from only thinking about ourselves to listening and obeying God as our highest priority. This transformation will produce an attitude of generosity and compassion as we become more like Christ in his attributes and character. I Corinthians 6:19-20 says, "Do you not

know that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which you have of God, and you are not your own? For you are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's." Peace Cross controversial

State Senate President Thomas V. Mike Miller and seven other senators are asking the U.S. Supreme Court to enter a dispute over whether a World War I memorial cross in Prince George's County, Maryland violates the separation of church and state.

In a "friend of the court" brief, the Democratic senators requested that the court review a 2017 ruling by a three-judge panel of the 4th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals that said the 40-foot-high "Peace Cross" in Bladensburg "excessively entangles the government in religion."

Miller and the other senators — some of whom are veterans — want the cross, which commemorates the county's World War I dead, preserved.

Their petition argues the appeals court's ruling conflicts with previous court decisions and the cross "is a prominent, shared civic space central to the communal life of Bladensburg" and Prince George's County.

Gov. Larry Hogan called a

cross-shaped war memorial in Prince George's County unconstitutional "outrageous" and an "overreach," and vowed that his administration would fight it.

In a social media post, the Republican governor wrote Friday he has passed by.

"Since its dedication in 1925, the Peace Cross has functioned as a shared civic space — a place for local residents to come together to honor American veterans and work together for the common good," the petition

A panel of the Virginia-based appeals court voted 2-1 in 2017 that the monument, at a busy intersection, "aggrandizes the Latin cross." In March, the court declined to rehear the case with all of its judges.

The senators joined the American Legion and the National Capital Park and Planning Commission in seeking the high court's review.

The other senators who filed the brief are Jim Rosapepe, Victor Ramirez, Katherine A. Klausmeier, Joanne C. Benson and Ulysses Currie, all from Prince George's


