**Classic car crashes into onlookers; one critically hurt**

THE DALLES — Authorities say one person was critically injured after a classic car driver accelerated quickly in The Dalles, flipped over and struck several people who were watching nearby.

The Dalles police responded to the incident around 10 p.m. Saturday.

Investigators say the driver was in a 1955 Chevy Bel-Air and rapidly accelerated after the light turned green. Some witnesses say the driver was trying to race a vehicle in the adjacent lane.

Police say the Chevy Bel-Air flipped over, struck a parked vehicle and injured people who were watching the classic car cruise. One person suffered critical injuries and was taken to the hospital.

The Chevy Bel-Air burst into flames after the crash. The driver suffered minor injuries. The driver was arrested on charges of second-degree assault.

**Health officials confirm measles case in Portland visitor**

PORTLAND — Health officials say a visitor to Portland was infected with measles, potentially exposing people to the virus.

The Oregon Health Authority is working to notify people who may have come in contact with the traveler, who was in the Portland area from July 30 to Aug. 6.

The agency says the virus spreads easily to those who aren't vaccinated, and people infected can spread it even before symptoms appear.

Symptoms include coughing, fever, runny nose and rash. It can cause ear and lung infections, diarrhea and brain swelling if not treated.

Officials expect symptoms to appear over the next two weeks in people who may have been recently infected.

Officials advise people who may be infected to call a doctor or emergency room before visiting those facilities.

**Motorcyclist killed, three injured in Klamath Falls crash**

KLAMATH FALLS — Authorities charged a Klamath Falls woman with manslaughter after a fiery crash that killed one motorcyclist and injured three others.

Klamath Falls police say 46-year-old Brenda Tobin was driving a pickup late Thursday when she turned directly into the path of two motorcycles.

One of the motorcycles collided with the pickup and caught fire, killing 37-year-old Terry Maxwell of Bonanza. A passenger on Maxwell's motorcycle suffered major injuries.

The second motorcycle struck the back of Maxwell's motorcycle, sending another two riders to the hospital.

The police department says officers developed probable cause to believe Tobin was driving under the influence of intoxicants. In addition to manslaughter, she was booked into jail on charges of assault, DUI and reckless endangerment.

**Hermiston man arrested while out on bail**

Esteban Muniz Aguilar of Hermiston faces new charges for harassing and molesting a woman.

Aguilar, 31, also goes by other names, including Esteban Salas. As Salas, he pleaded not guilty on July 18 to four counts of first-degree sexual abuse involving a victim in Hermiston. The Umatilla County District Attorney's Office alleged Salas molested a girl younger than 14 from late June 2017 to about mid-March 2018.

He posted \$10,000 bail on July 24 to get out of the jail, and

ended up back there Thursday.

The Boardman Police Department investigated a case Thursday morning and developed probable cause to arrest Aguilar. Hermiston Police Chief Jason Edmiston reported Boardman police had one officer on duty at the time and sent the probable cause affidavit to his department.

"We obviously had a vested interest, if you will, because of our investigation earlier," Edmiston said.

Hermiston detectives searched for Aguilar/Salas and caught him at a traffic stop. The Morrow County District Attorney's Office charged him with third-degree sexual abuse, harassment and trespassing, according to court records. His arraignment on the new charges was Friday.

**FBI recovers flight data recorder from plane**

Authorities have recovered the flight data recorder from a plane taken by an airline worker who performed dangerous loops before crashing into an island in Washington's Puget Sound.

The FBI says it has also found components of the cockpit voice recorder from the Horizon plane.

The NTSB is now processing the equipment.

Richard Russell, 29, of Sumner, Washington, stole the commercial plane Friday night from Sea-Tac International Airport, performing acrobatic stunts before crashing into a thick island forest. Russell worked for Horizon as a ground service agent.

The FBI said Sunday that human remains were found at the scene.

The Pierce County Medical Examiner's Office confirmed Sunday that Russell died in the fiery wreckage.

Whether the crash was deliberate or accidental was one of several topics remaining for investigators.

**Deputies rescue women stranded on unicorn raft**

It was not a fairy tale, but a rescue on a Minnesota lake did involve a rainbow unicorn.

A sheriff's deputy and a reserve deputy from the Chisago County Sheriff's Office spotted a group of five women on a large, inflatable

rainbow unicorn floating on Fish Lake Saturday.

KMSP-TV reports the deputies pulled their squad car over and asked the women for a photo, but noticed the raft was stuck in weeds.

One deputy threw a rope

to the women while the other recorded a video. A sheriff's office tweet says, "With a handful of laughs and some mad rescue roping skills they were pulled back to the dock!"

Deputy Scotty Finnegan,

who threw the rope, says the women would have had

trouble getting out of the mucky lake unassisted.
