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in — with four kills and three blocks.

"It's a little hard to hit around her when she's there on her block. We just need to work on some timing, and the middles need to work on getting close to her, because if they are close to her, then it's a big block," McLean-Morehead said.

EOU added a 7-1 run later in the set, capped by a kill from Bunn, to take a 20-7 lead and coast to the win of the second set.

While the coach said the block is an area where EOU still needs to develop, its potential — in conjunction with the team's defense and scrappiness — was shown in particular at one point in the third set.

Eastern and Whitman locked up in a lengthy rally midway through the set before Taylor and Madison Pilon combined for a block and a 14-6 lead — part of an 8-0 EOU

run and a stretch where the Mountaineers scored three points in a row off its block.

EOU's defense, by the way, recorded 49 digs, led by Holli Mullins with 11 and Kiley McMurtrey with seven.

"Our serve-receive and floor defense are solid," McLean-Morehead said.

Sarah Carpenter had 15 assists to lead EOU for the fourth time this season. She credited the coach with knowing how to tinker with the offensive rotations.

"Kaki does a good job of putting the right setters with the right hitters," she said.

The senior added that she and the other setters, Pilon and Abby Smith, "are connecting way better with our middles, and the other team struggles when our middles are getting the ball down."

Eastern (4-0 overall) returns to the road Friday and Saturday at the Big Sky Invitational in Butte, Montana. It opens play at the Invite against Vanguard, California.

Where EOU needs to regroup the most is on defense, which was impacted by the graduation of defender Rosalie Salisbury and midfielders Yasmin Mookerdum and Mariana Madrigal.

The defense allowed only eight goals all season a year ago, and was ranked in the top 10 at the NAIA level.

Among the returners on the back line, though, are starters Josee Bassett and Chelsey Nicol. Those two will mix with both newcomers and returners who saw limited action last year, but could be just as strong on the defensive end.

"Obviously we have a few more moving parts, so it's about getting on the same page and (getting) the style

of play (down)," Plocher said. Returner Danelle Davidial, freshman Yahaira Chavvaria-Mondragon and transfers Emily Bliven and Danielle Nicotera are just a few of the players who could fill a major role on the defensive back line.

The defense will be anchored in the back by goalkeeper Cydni Cottrell, who had eight shutouts last season.

"She did great (and) our back line definitely helped her out. It'll be potentially a


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bit more on her shoulders, but she should be able to handle that," Plocher said.


