Quinn, a sophomore, won a wide-open quarterback competition with Saige Wilkerson and Joey Aliff and will be the starter Saturday, Camp said.

"I think a year of playing has widened the gap between them," Camp said. "(Quinn) understands the system. He has a strong arm, and he doesn't take so many shots (like) he used to."

He'll have three of his top four favorite targets from last year back in wide receivers Brenden Kelly, T.J. Hancock and Nico Chavez.

Dias will likely be sharing time in the backfield with Kaler Moore and Jamill Thomas, a junior college transfer who Camp said "is going to be special."

That offense will be looking to move the ball against a Yotes' defense that allowed 409 yards and nearly 27 points per game last fall.

Defensively, Eastern has to key on trying to slow down C of I quarterback Darius Peterson, who last fall passed for 1,820

yards, rushed for 1,011 yards and scored 20 touchdowns.

"We have to contain him," Camp said. "He's a runner. He's a dual-threat quarterback."

The Yotes did lose two of their top receivers from last fall, but in spite of that EOU knows C of I is a team Mountaineers shouldn't take the team lightly.

Junior defensive back Isaiah Richie said there's also a desire for payback not only after the sweep from last year, but considering the Yotes have won the last two contests at Community Stadium.

"They're a good team. We're a good team. We match up very well," he said. "They're fast. We're fast. They beat us last year, so we're trying to get some revenge. We've been waiting since winter (for this game)."

Camp said a key for the entire season on defense, but especially in Saturday's opener, is for the team to wrap up. He said it's vital in the first game "because then you can build off it. You don't want to go out there and have 15-20 missed tackles. That's not going to come out well. We focused on tackling all camp."
