TODAY'S HIGHLIGHT

On August 27, 1928, the Kellogg-Briand Pact was signed in Paris, outlawing war and providing for the peaceful settlement of disputes.

ON THIS DATE

In 1776, the Battle of Long Island began during the Revolutionary War as British troops attacked American forces who ended up being forced to retreat two days later.

In 1859, Edwin L. Drake drilled the first successful oil well in the United States, at Titusville, Pa.

In 1883, the island volcano Krakatoa erupted with a series of cataclysmic explosions; the resulting tidal waves in Indonesia's Sunda Strait claimed some 36,000 lives in Java and Sumatra.

In 1892, fire seriously damaged New York's original Metropolitan Opera House.

In 1949, a violent white mob prevented an outdoor concert headlined by Paul Robeson from taking place near Peekskill, New York. (The concert was held eight days later.)

In 1962, the United States launched the Mariner 2 space probe, which flew past Venus in December 1962.

Milton-Freewater drive-by shooting leads to attempted murder charges

Friday night's drive-by shooting in Milton-Freewater. The Umatilla County District Attorney's Office on Thursday arraigned Cantu, 27, on the following: three counts of attempted murder; two counts of unlawful use of a weapon; one for felon in possession of a firearm, all felonies; and seven misdemeanor counts of recklessly endangering another person.

Court records don't indicate if Cantu entered a plea. His next hearing is Sept. 11. For now, he remains in the Umatilla County Jail, Pendleton, in lieu of \$1.81 million bail.

The charges come from a secret indictment, according to court records, which a grand jury handed up Tuesday after hearing from four witnesses, including two Milton-Freewater police officers.

Cantu is one of four suspects in the shooting, which Milton-Freewater police reported was gang related. There were no injuries. He was in jail in Walla Walla for attempting to elude a police vehicle, according to the Walla Walla Union-Bulletin, but posted bail Tuesday. Milton-Freewater police took Cantu into custody Wednesday afternoon in Pendleton.

Pendleton Police Chief Stuart Roberts said Milton-Freewater police detective

Morgan Dunlap asked for help in contacting Cantu, who works at Keystone RV off Westgate in Pendleton. Dunlap and Pendleton officers met with Cantu, and the detective booked the suspect into the Pendleton jail on the secret indictment.

Charley Lozano Magana and Juan Venegas Esquivel, both 24 and Walla Walla residents, remain in jail in Walla Walla. The Union-Bulletin reported they appeared Thursday in Walla Walla County Superior Court and waived extradition to face charges in Umatilla County.

Police reported the fourth suspect is a juvenile but have not released his identity.

The shooting took place late Friday, according to police, and the suspects fled in a vehicle to Walla Walla, where law enforcement spotted and pursued them. They crashed near 5-Mile Road, bailed out and ran.

Officers soon caught Magana and Esquivel, and later arrested Cantu. Walla Walla police reported catching the juvenile took a bit more effort.

After the crash, Farel joined the search for the suspects. Farel is one of the police dogs for Walla Walla. Farel found a piece of clothing and tracked the scent to a nearby winery.

"Officers found people outside enjoying an event," according to a written statement from Walla Walla police, "and were advised the suspect took an Uber."

Police called the ride service and arrested the teen in Milton-Freewater.
