#### **Public use restrictions** eased in forests

Public use restrictions on the Umatilla National Forest and forests within the Oregon Department of Forestry Northeast Oregon District dropped to Phase A as of Aug. 28. Fire managers have eased the restrictions due to cooler weather conditions and a decrease in fire danger. Phase A is the second level of restrictions, generally implemented when the fire danger is moderate to high. Currently, chainsaws may be operated only between the hours of 8 p.m. and 10 a.m. (ODF) or 1 p.m.

(Umatilla), and a one-hour fire watch is required after saw operations cease. Smoking is allowed only in enclosed vehicles, buildings or cleared areas. Off-road/ off-trail vehicle travel or travel on roads is restricted. Campfires are allowed in designated areas, in fire pits surrounded by dirt, rock or commercial rings and in areas not conducive to rapid fire spread. Fire Season is still in effect, and debris burning (including burn barrels) is also currently prohibited by the

"I ran into a bunch of people (in my private mental health practice) who could've used this kind of practical help," she said.

A La Grande native, Voetberg's

professional career encompasses stints as a rehab teacher, social worker and mental health therapist — experiences she's eager to put to use at Abundant

"It's one thing to sit in an office with a therapist and tell them your struggles (and) it's another to get them solved," she said. "(When) you do something like (ALTS) you really see a change in the community."

That change is at the core of why Voetberg and her partners chose to create Abundant Life.

"I've been in a 'people helping' profession my whole life. I get a kick out of seeing people break through and get on their feet," she said. "It's the thrill of seeing people actually succeed."
