Anne was born April 17, 1924, in Hollywood, California. She started school in the academy in Medford, moved to the Portland area and then settled in La Grande, where she was very active at La Grande High School in music, journalism and Honor Society. Anne was the first female La Grande High School Student Body Vice President.

Anne graduated from La Grande High School in 1942 then earned a degree in dietetics and institution management from Oregon State University. While at OSU she was a member and president of Kappa Kappa Gamma sorority and remained active in journalism as the manager of OSU's newspaper, The Daily Barometer. Anne completed her dietetic internship at Charity Hospital in New Orleans, Louisiana. After graduating from Oregon State, she worked at St. Elizabeth Hospital in Baker City until marrying Bruce Kirkpatrick on June 25, 1949.

Anne and Bruce continued to live in Baker City, where Bruce had a Chevrolet automobile business. Anne was an active homemaker in the 1950s-1970s, raising four children. She returned to dietetics in the 1960s, commuting to Grande Ronde Hospital and working as a clinical dietitian until retiring in 1976.

Anne loved to play bridge, travel and read. She was active in the First Presbyterian Church, PEO Chapter AX, multiple bridge clubs and AAUW, and she was a dedicated board member of the DeWuhs Keckritz Educational Foundation Scholarship board for 22 years. Anne was especially committed to helping young people with furthering their education.
