the third quarter. An interception by Quinn led to a short field and an 11-yard touchdown catch by Trevor Hoffman that got Montana Tech on the board early in the third quarter. Quinn went down two series later on a quarterback scramble, and EOU committed turnovers on three of its next four offensive plays - two interceptions and a fumble — that eventually led to two more touchdowns and Tech taking a 21-17 lead late in the third quarter on a six-yard TD catch by Kenny Lafayette.

All three of the Orediggers' touchdown drives in the third were 22 yards or less. Eastern forced a fifth

Montana Tech turnover in the final quarter when Justin Hughes grabbed an interception but was unable to get back on the board.

EOU limited Montana Tech to just 278 yards, but gained only 312 yards when it was on offense. Quinn was 16-for-33 for 163 yards passing and added 33 yards rushing. Saige Wilkerson and Joey Aliff, who both filled in as quarterback, combined to go 4-for-15 for 23 yards with two interceptions. Dias led the EOU ground game with 64 yards rushing, and John Lesser added 69 vards receiving.

Jed Fike led Montana Tech with 151 yards rushing, and Hoffman turned in 59 yards receiving and scored twice.
