swing the game in La Grande's favor.
The first one in that stretch, collected
by Josh Zollman, ended a Riverhawks
drive with La Grande up just 20-12 and
led to Shaw's third TD reception. Wyatt
Earp and Zamora both also got in on the
act during the frenzy.

"I was just in my coverage. I read the
quarterback's eyes, he looked right at
the receiver (and) I went up and made a
play," Zamora said of what happened on
his picks.

Earlier in the contest, Gabe Shukle
collected an interception for La Grande,
and both Nathan Reed and Spencer
Gerst recovered fumbles.

Helseth threw for 346 yards but was
held to just 27-of-64 passing. Zamora
said the La Grande defense had to focus
knowing that Helseth was going to
throw the ball a lot, especially with The
Dalles trailing and managing just five
yards rushing on the night.

"Just expect the ball every time. Be
ready for it," Zamora said.

La Grande appeared ready to turn
the game into a blowout after the two
early TD receptions by Shaw made it
13-0 with 5:25 in the first quarter.

But Robinson left midway through
the first half with a right left injury, forc-
ing Shaw to take over at quarterback.
After the offense stalled a couple times,
Shaw found the end zone again, scoring
on a 35-yard scamper for a 20-0 lead.

Ty'jean Green scored on a 25-yard
catch and run to get The Dalles on the
board late in the half and make it 20-6
at the break. Denver Neill's five-yard

run made it a one-score game late in the
third before La Grande's ball-hawking
defense took over.

Robinson returned at the start of the
third quarter and finished 9-for-17 pass-
ing for 202 yards.

Reed, who rushed for 78 yards, helped
ice the game with rushing touchdowns
of six and 17 yards in the fourth quarter.

La Grande (1-1 overall) returns to
the road Friday when it travels to face
defending Greater Oregon League
champion Ontario to open GOL action.

IMBLER ROUTS UNION
Ryan Patterson rushed for 184 yards
and scored three touchdowns, Isaac Her-
ron added 111 yards and a TD, and the
Imbler Panthers roughed up the Union
Bobcats, 46-16, Friday night in the Spec-
ial District 3 opener for both teams.
Chance Goodman added 130 yards on
10-for-12 passing and threw two touch-
downs for Imbler, which raced out to a
38-0 halftime lead and never looked back.

The Panthers gained 319 yards on the
ground and racked 449 yards of total
offense. Wade McDonald had six catches
for 68 yards and two scores for Imbler.
Union was led by Tate Lantis, who
rushed for 112 yards and two touch-
downs. Levi Obindorf added 70 yards
rushing, and Gannon Carreiro rushed
for 56 yards

host Enterprise Friday, while Union (1-
1, 0-1) travels to Dufur.
WALLOWA PUMMELS BADGERS
Gus Ramsden accounted for six
touchdowns, including four in the sec-
ond quarter, and the Wallowa Cougars
bounced back from their season-opening

loss at St. Paul to thump the Powder
Valley Badgers, 60-0, Friday night in the
Special District 3 opener for both teams.

Ramsden had touchdown runs of
eight, 66 and 40 yards in the second
quarter, and added a 30-yard intercep-
tion return for a touchdown to seal
the second for a 44-0 halftime lead. He
also had a 61-yard touchdown pass to
Freddy DeVore in the first quarter and a
one-yard TD run in the third. The senior
quarterback finished with 143 yards
rushing and 61 yards passing.

Austin Brockamp added 166 rushing
yards and had an 80-yard touchdown
run in the first quarter for Wallowa. Zeb
Ramsden was also close to 100 yards on
offense, finishing with 95 yards.

Powder Valley was held to just 13
yards of offense, including minus-34
yards rushing, and turned the ball over
four times.

Wallowa (1-1 overall, 1-0 SD3) travels
to Elgin Friday, while Powder Valley (1-
1, 0-1) hosts Pine Eagle Friday.
