“We talked a lot about making sure that we take it one point at a time and never give up, even if the score is at game point,” the coach said. The Tigers mounted a similar rally to take the second set, which found them down 22-20 after an error. Seavert put down three consecutive kills for the lead, and three points later Kenzie Williams tallied a kill for the set and a 2-0 advantage. “We really focused on not getting in our heads and getting down,” Seavert said. “We were always like, We have to get back in it. We’re not done yet. We’re still in this.” La Grande nearly staged a wild comeback to take the match in three sets, rallying from a 23-16 deficit to get within two points late before the Bulldogs forced a fourth set, but Becker-Bisenius said that late run helped going into the fourth set. “We got down in a really big hole, but they fought out of that,” she said, “That gave us some momentum going into the fourth.” A 5-2 run in the fourth set, capped by back-to-back kills by Jaiden Hafer and Williams, gave La Grande the lead for good at 17-14. Justice’s second ace of the night extended the lead later to 21-16, and Baker got no closer than four points the rest of the way.

Williams added a strong all-around game with 18 assists, 17 digs and nine kills for La Grande. Jacie Howton had 22 assists and 13 digs, and Felicity Houston tallied 28 digs. La Grande (14-4 overall, 5-0 GOL) travels to the Seaside Tournament Saturday.

There should be no (reason) why this team doesn’t succeed this year.” The Mountaineers open the season today and Saturday in the Quinn Classic against Salish Kootenai and New Hope Christian. The Mountaineers open CCC play at home Nov. 30 against Southern Oregon and face defending CCC champion College of Idaho for the first time Dec. 18 in Caldwell.
